Principal's Message

Dear Families,

As we reach the midway point of the school year, I stop and pause to recognize how far our students have come in their learning. Ralph Brown staff have been working collaboratively with their colleagues to ensure we are providing a learning environment that fosters inclusion, values diversity offers opportunity and supports growth in learning. We continue to build a sense of community in our school through our weekly buddy class activities, strengthening connections between students across grades. Our teachers participated in their second day of Treaty Education this month. This professional development opportunity allows educators to further embed Indigenous perspectives in their teaching, ensuring that students gain a deeper understanding of our shared history and commitments.

Last month, our English-Ukrainian Bilingual Program students welcomed families and guests to our traditional Ukrainian Christmas Concert. The event featured a beautiful performance of carolling, verses and greetings that created a warm and festive atmosphere for all in attendance. Families and guests enjoyed refreshments, and we extend our heartfelt gratitude to the volunteers who assisted with food preparations, making this event a memorable celebration. Some students from our grades 4-8 classes concluded the festive season by carolling to local businesses in the community.

February is a busy and exciting month! We are celebrating "I Love to Read", welcoming special guest readers and have events throughout the latter half of the month to inspire a love for books – with a healthy and yummy twist! Student clubs are up and running over the lunch hour and after school. Our skating club for grades 4-8 is in full swing. Students have been enjoying the winter weather over the lunch hour on the outdoor skating rink. Our grades 1-3 have the opportunity to take part in Spanish club, while our intermediate classes are involved in Destination Imagination and choir practice for the Manitoba Festival. We also recognize the 3rd anniversary of the war in Ukraine that has significant meaning to many of our students, families and school. Additionally, some classrooms will embark on excursions embracing the beauty of winter. Please note there will be no school on Monday, February 17.

They cross before/after school and at lunch. A reminder that school begins at 8:55 am and 12:55 pm, and pick-ups take place at designated playground doors at the back of the school.

The Anishinaabe calendar is deeply rooted in the cycles of the moon, where each moon is named after a natural event occurring at that time. February is known as the Bear Moon, or Makwa Giizis, where bear gives Mother Earth a rest for a few months and reminds us humans to do the same thing. We encourage families to cuddle up for some story sharing or with a good book and explore the joy of relating and reading together. Wishing you a wonderful February!
