#### Principal's Message

Dear Families,

This is it! June is here and that means we are in the final 20 days of school. What a year it has been. Our primary classes have engaged in nature based learning throughout the year. P4 and P6 students were engaged in inquiry learning about woodpeckers. Room 104 worked on their Mindcraft neighbourhood project.
