P3 PLANS 7 DAY TRIP TO INDIA

We planned a 7- Day trip from Canada to India. We prepared our Canadian passports and researched various websites to book our flights from Winnipeg to India.



Day1 - Flights: We took the Air Canada flight # 777 Boeing from James Armstrong Richardson Airport, Winnipeg (YWG) to Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi (DEL).

Day2 - Exploration fantasy: We explored the trips to the Top 4 Indian metro cities; New Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai. We watched different dresses worn by Indian people, and saw various modes of transportation.

Day4 - The magnificent Taj Mahal: We explored the beauty of Taj Mahal (one of 7 wonders of the world) on full moon night.


