Principal's Message

Dear Families,

We are thankful! We are thankful that spring has arrived. We are thankful for you and all of the wonderful families that make up this school community. We are thankful that we can gather together and celebrate as we did for our Ukrainian Easter Breakfast and our Family Math Night. We are thankful to see our student population grow in both our English program and English-Ukrainian Bilingual Program (EUBP). Currently we have 326 students! This is a significant growth and we have enjoyed welcoming the many new families to our school.

April was a very busy month at Ralph Brown. Students in the EUBP participated in Pysanka Workshops (Ukrainian Easter Egg decorating). It was a great opportunity to learn about the art, culture and traditions of Ukraine. We were able to have our traditional Ukrainian Easter breakfast for the students and staff in the EUBP. Students were able to enjoy traditional Ukrainian foods such as Paska, kovbasa and cottage cheese to name a few and some delicious desserts provided by the families of students in the EUBP.

After each reporting period, I meet with each teacher to review their students' progress and their planning for learning going forward. The goal of these meetings is to look at student needs and plan for targeted instruction to move a child's learning forward. Ms. Lobban is also apart of these meetings so that as a team, we can be intentional about our planning for learning so that we can provide the best learning experience for your children.

On Thursday, April 20th, we held a Family Math Night. It was a great success with over 100 people in attendance not including our staff. Thank you to those families that came out to engage in fun math activities. Having taught math to students in grades 8 and 9, I met many students who felt they were not good at math and I met many parents and grandparents who felt math is different or they too were not strong in math. I want to encourage all of you by saying you can learn

it and understand it. We hope families enjoyed the event and plan to join us again for future events. One of the best parts of the evening was simply being in community with each other.

Each year our Parent Advisory Council (PAC) holds an election for the Executive members for the following year. These positions are the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Fundraising Coordinator. We have a dedicated group of parent volunteers who have served in these positions for the last 2-3 years.
