## Principal's Message

#### Dear Families:

Its hard to believe we are approaching the end of our first term. Be sure to look out for the Parent-Student-Teacher Conference letters so we can talk about your child's learning and progress in school.

Staff and Students recognized Truth and Reconciliation Day with a community walk in addition to their classroom discussions and learning about the Calls to Action. In October, students engaged in learning about Residential Schools and the impact it had and continues to have on Indigenous people and families. We acknowledge that hearing these stories is part of recognizing the truth which will help us in our work towards reconciliation. Did you know that we begin each day with the Land Acknowledgement statement in English and Ukrainian? We strive to have students think deeply about the land acknowledge so it is more than just something we say and do.

For the first time in a very long time, staff across the division engaged in professional learning. In addition to the main speaker, three different high schools had students share their learning with us. One of the groups preformed drumming in circle sharing the Bear Song with us. In the afternoon, the teaching staff returned to Ralph Brown to continue our learning about mathematics and how to improve our practice to support student learning.

On November 1st, all staff of Ralph Brown will attend more professional development related to Treaty Education. This will be a school closure day for Ralph Brown. This is mandatory professional development for all staff. In January, the teaching staff will participate in a second day of learning as a follow up.

Once again, Mr. Karpenko transformed the gymnasium into "Halloween Gym" complete with obstacle courses and fun activities. For the first time ever, Mr. Karpenko had help from our second Phys. Ed. teacher, Mr. Thomson. Our Halloween fun day wouldn't

be complete without our traditional parade to show off all our costumes.

Looking forward into November, on November 8th we will gather to acknowledge the courage and sacrifice of those who served our country. It is also a day when we are reminded of our own responsibility to work for the peace they fought hard to achieve. Ralph Brown School also remembers Holodomor. We will gather again on November 28th to remember the great famine that killed millions of Ukrainians caused by Soviet policies. We can not forget either of these dark parts of our history.





#### STUDENT SAFETY!

We are once again asking for parents' help in supporting the school rules regarding

#### **Entry/Exit Doors.**

Students are expected to be entering and exiting the school through their own doors (i.e. off of the playground).

The front doors are reserved for adults, deliveries, late arrivals, etc. We find this practice keeps the school running much more smoothly. Unless students are with an adult, we ask them to go around to the playground and not "cut" through the school

#### "No Drop" Zone

Parents are asked NOT to drop off/pick up their child in a vehicle at the front of the school. We have had problems in the past with this area getting very congested. The onset of slippery roads and high snowbanks will make this practice even more hazardous.

Parents are directed to use Church Avenue as their drop off point; with the students going directly into the playground. Alternatively, the school parking lot (in front of the Rec Centre) is an ideal place for dropping off or waiting to pick up students.

#### **SCHOOL COMMUNICATION**

In addition to sending home paper copies of the newsletter, permission slips, etc. we are making use of School Messenger more and more to send emails to families.

It is very important that we have current contact information for all our students (both phone numbers and email), not only in case of illness or emergencies regarding your child, but to communicate all upcoming school closures, events and reminders.

#### Absences/Lates

Parents are encouraged to enter their child's absence (for whatever reason) or that they will be arriving late into the Safe Arrival

Absence Management System instead of calling into the school.

The office can get quite hectic with substitutes arriving and requiring assistance, opening exercises and announcements, late students arriving, etc. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

#### **SCHOOL SAFETY**

Each year we practice elements of our school safety plan. In addition to monthly fire drills and one evacuation practice, we also rehearse our Lockdown and Hold & Secure procedures.

A **Lockdown** is a critical incident response that secures students and staff to prevent access or harm to the occupants of a location. This may also involve quickly moving students and staff from unsecured locations to secure locations. Students and staff have been taught to follow specific protocols when a lockdown is activated. A lockdown drill will be practiced 3 times annually.

A Hold and Secure is used when it is desirable to secure the school due to an emergency situation occurring outside in the community. In this situation, all exterior doors are locked and monitored. They will remain locked until the Hold and Secure is cleared. Classes and movement within the building will continue to function normally. When a Hold and Secure is activated, signage will be posted on the exterior doors notifying parents/guardians, other visitors to the school that doors will remain locked until the Hold and Secure is cleared. Until such time, there is no entry into or exit out of the building. Parents/Guardians who happen to arrive during a Hold and Secure will need to take shelter in a safe space away from the building. This drill is practiced 3 times annually.

#### STUDENT SUPERVISION

Just a reminder that students should <u>not</u> be arriving to school prior to <u>8:50</u> am (unless they are attending Breakfast Program in the Rec) or <u>12:50 pm</u> as there is no playground supervision. In the event of severe weather, students will be allowed into the school at that time.
