

Restorative Practices range from:

- Informal conversation with student
- Restorative mediation with teacher or administrator
- Phone call to Parent(s) / Guardian(s)
- Formal conference with Parent(s) / Guardian(s)
- Adapted privileges
- In-school suspension - student works in a designated area away from other students. Parent(s)/ Guardian(s) to be notified.
- The creation of an Individual Student Behaviour Plan.
- Out of school suspension - suspension from school as set by Division Policy JGD. This may occur as a result of repeated non-compliance or inability to respect school climate. The maximum single suspension is as follows:
 - A) Principal - up to five days. More than one week requires Superintendent's approval
 - B) Superintendent - up to six weeks. In all cases of suspension, the Parent(s) / Guardian(s) are notified.
- Expulsion - in accordance with School Division Policy. This measure will be recommended only in extreme circumstances or after all other attempts at intervention have proven unsuccessful in changing behaviour.



Lates & Absences

- Parent(s) / Guardian(s) must call the school if a student will be late or absent.
- Should the school not receive notification of an absence the Parent(s)/ Guardian(s) will be called by the school.
- Students who arrive late must report to the office to indicate their arrival.
- Parent(s)/Guardian(s) are required to contact the school office should their child need to leave the school early for an appointment.
- Parents must report to the office to pick up their child.

End of the Day Dismissal

Students should go home/daycare at dismissal times unless previous arrangements have been made with parent / guardian and communicated to the school clerk.

Parent Run Lunch Program

Students are expected to:

- Treat all students and adult supervisors with respect.
- Use proper table manners
- Remain seated until it is time to go out for recess.

When a student does not follow the Lunch Program rules Parent(s) / Guardian(s) will be notified by phone or in writing by the Lunch Program Director.

Depending on the severity of the situation a student may be removed from the Lunch Program.

Positive Behavior at École Riverview School

Students will be made aware of the school and the division Codes of Conduct.
