

Indoor recess

During the winter months, the wind chill is checked before morning recess, lunch time and afternoon recess.

Students are expected to dress appropriately for the weather at all times. As per WSD policy, students will be kept indoors only on inclement days when the wind chill reaches -28° Celsius. When the wind chill is between -25° to -27° , students may go out for a shortened 10 minute recess.

At times, parents and guardians have requested by a note to the classroom teacher or a phone call to the school, to have their child remain indoors at recess time. It is our school's belief that if a students is too sick to go outdoors at recess, then he or she is too sick to be at school.

If you would like your child to stay at the school during that time, the lunch program is available on a full-time basis, at a cost of \$280.00 for the year. We are starting our ceramics unit in Grade 7 and 8 making our own mugs using hand building techniques. Instead of throwing clay on a pottery wheel, students learned how to create a mug using a pinch pot method for the base and coil building for the height. Once they're glazed and food safe (the shiny coat on a mug), we will celebrate our art with hot chocolate and marshmallow/movie day with our own handmade mug.

Throughout the month of November, in Performing Arts, the Grade 8 students have been continuing to develop their guitar, piano and ukulele skills through learning covers of holiday songs in both small and large groups. 

In partnership with Harvest Manitoba, we are encouraging the whole school to donate non-perishable food items. Help us reach our goal of 1,200 food items!


> The ÉSKS Leadership Food Drive runs from Thursday, December 4th to Thursday, December 15th.



With the colder weather comes icy conditions. Please be aware of our patrols out on post while you are driving, for your safety and theirs!


