#### **Administrator's Message**

Dear ÉSKS Families,

Welcome to November! With an early snow, looks like we are fully into winter!

As we move into a reporting period, teachers are busy working with groups of students to assess student understanding. As much as possible students are involved in talking about their own learning and we are building their skill-set of reflection and goal-setting. There has been a slight shift in some areas of the report card that will go out mid-month; a separate email will go out to families to explain what you will see that is a little different. Teachers continue to assess your child's understanding in relation to provincial curricular outcomes and will comment on your child's strengths, what they haven't yet mastered, and how they will support your child with their next steps. We strongly encourage all parents to attend the tri-conference with their child - again, so that all of our students play an active role in hearing about and talking about their own learning.

One of our school-wide goals is providing ongoing opportunities for student TALK. Why talk? Are you thinking that you already hear lots of talking at your place? Well here is what research tells us about guiding opportunities for student talk - it allows students to:

- Organize their thoughts
- Express thoughts, questions, ideas & points of view
- Gather and process information (plan a project, conduct an interview...)
- Collaborate to solve problems and make decisions
- Make connections to prior knowledge and experiences
- Expand on their own thinking and the thinking of others
- Present their findings and express their ideas (literacytoday.ca)

We have two Remembrance Day Ceremonies planned for November 10th. Our elementary students will assemble at 9:30am and our students in Grade 7 & 8 will assemble at 10:30am. We find ways to make these assemblies meaningful to students of all ages. If you or a family member have served in the military and would be willing to share some of your experiences with students, we would love to hear from you.

With sports teams and clubs in full swing, we again thank our teachers for their ongoing support of our students. Staff are working very hard to ensure that your children have a wide variety of experiences and opportunities. We thank our Parent Advisory Council (PAC) for their recent work to provide Halloween dances. Students and families greatly enjoyed these events.

As always, our classroom/home partnership is important to all of us. Please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher if ever you have a question or a concern. We look forward to seeing you at the conferences on November 16th or 17th!

#### **Lunch Program**

A few friendly reminders to all Stanley Knowles Lunch Program Families:

- ◆ As the weather is getting colder, please make sure your children are dressed appropriately for the weather. Grades 1 to 8 students will continue going outdoors during the lunch hour, unless the temperature is below −25° with the wind chill.
- ◆ There are limited spaces remaining for new Lunch Program registrations, students will be placed on a waitlist if there are no more spaces available. Students who are NOT registered with the Lunch Program must make other plans and leave school property over the lunch hour as there is no supervision provided by the school. Be sure to register as soon as possible if you need a space. In case of an emergency, we do offer a drop in program for \$4.00 a day/per child.

### Why the Poppy?

The association between the poppy and war dates back to the Napoleonic wars, when a writer saw a field of poppies growing over the graves of fallen solders. During the battle of Ypres in 1915, Canadian Lt.-Col. John McCrae was inspired to write the poem In Flanders Fields on sighting the poppies growing beside a grave of a close friend who had died in hattle

## **Cold Weather Reminders**

#### **Students Arrival At School**

When the cold weather has truly arrived, we remind parents, guardians and students that they should arrive at school **NO EARLIER** than 8:45 am and 12:40 pm, as there is **NO** supervision provided earlier than 8:40am, students are expected to wait outside .

Students arriving before the above times will have to wait outside in the cold weather.

#### **Indoor Recess Policy**

During the winter months, the wind chill is checked before morning recess, lunch time and afternoon recess.

Students are expected to dress appropriately for the weather at all times. As per WSD policy, students will be kept indoors only on inclement days when the wind chill reaches –28° Celsius. When the wind chill is between –25° to –27°, students may go out for a shortened 10 minute recess.



At times, parents and guardians have requested by a note to the classroom teacher or a phone call to the school, to have their child remain indoors at recess time. Please keep children who are ill at home and follow Public Health guidelines.

We would ask parents and guardians to send children to school only when they are well enough to participate in all activities, including recess.

#### **Emergency School Closing**

In the event of an emergency school closing, our first concern is the safety of our students. The decision to close the school is made by the Chief Superintendent and media outlets will be contacted so they broadcast and/or post school cancellation information.

In case our school needs to be evacuated on short notice, an alternate shelter is required. Tyndall Park School will serve as our alternate shelter. The school is located at 2221 King Edward Street and their phone number is 204-633-0065.

It is our sincere hope that a threatening emergency will never occur. However, instructing your children as to your expectations will assist in ensuring their health and safety under emergency conditions.
