Greetings Stanley Knowles Families,

We are well underway as October begins at School. Our classrooms are bustling with learning and some of our older students are involved in extra—curricular sports, such as cross country running and volleyball. Our runners have their meets on Wednesday afternoons at different divisional locations.

At École Stanley Knowles School our first priority is to ensure the safety and well-being of your children while they are in school. We will be practicing safety drills: fire evacuations, lock downs and hold and secure drills.

Here at École Stanley Knowles, we believe in being pro-active in creating a positive learning environment. All PBIS expectations at ÉSKS are based on the following anchors: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Learners and Be Safe. For example, when students are entering the building, we believe that to be respectful, we use a quiet voice and allows visitors to enter and exit. To be safe, we keep entrances and doorways clear and keep our hands and feet to ourselves. Our entire school has revisited what these behaviours look like through the common areas of the school and while we are outdoors.

We continue to look for ways to infuse Indigenous perspectives into the work that we do at school each day. We had a memorable week leading up to the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation. Classrooms listened to stories, did research into residential schools, had conversations and reflected about reconciliation, listened to teachings about local plants and how they are used traditionally by Indigenous communities, and a gallery walk. We also met for a school assembly with traditional dancing and shared stories. All staff and students were encouraged to wear orange shirts on Wednesday, September 27th. It promises to be a wonderful month!

What is your child's plan for lunch?


With the cold weather fast approaching, it becomes more important than ever that **ALL students** have a plan for their lunch hour.

As the school division does not provide any formal supervision over the lunch hour, all students who are not part of the paid Lunch Program must leave the building and school grounds over the lunch hour.

If you need a place for your child to be during the lunch hour, please be sure to register for the Lunch Program. It is available FULL-TIME at a cost of \$28/month or DROP-IN* at a cost of \$4/day (registration forms should be filled out for both)

* Please note that effective October 1st our registration grace period has ended and students will <u>not be able to stay</u> in the drop-in <u>without bringing their payment</u>.







Did you know...

It's okay to leave those piles of leaves on the ground all winter long. In fact, it can be really beneficial to leave them in place. The Nature Conservancy of Canada recommends leaving all those beautiful leaves in place because they provide an important winter habitat for many small creatures to survive the winter months. Beneficial insects that pollinate our gardens, like butterflies, moths and other insects use the leaves as a winter hideout. They also contain fallen fruits and seeds that birds rely on for a food source.


If you prefer to keep your grass free from leaves, please make sure you are putting the leaves in a compost bin or leaving them on the curb, in a paper bag or pail, for the city to pick up and compost.

Did you know?

In addition to having regular Fire Drills, we will also be practicing Lock Down and Hold and Secure Procedures. These drills are not intended to alarm students, but rather ensure that they are aware of what to do should an emergency situation arise. It's imperative that all drills happen quickly and effectively.

In a **Lock Down** drill, an unwanted intruder has entered the school building. All classrooms in the school are secured, and the students are kept inside the classroom with the lights off and away from the windows until classroom teachers are advised by School Administrators that the threat is over.

In a **Hold and Secure** drill, unwanted individuals are outside the building trying to get in. All entrances to the school are secured and no one is allowed to enter or exit the building until the threat is over. During a Hold and Secure drill, signs will be posted at each outside entrance alerting anyone trying to enter the school, but classes inside the building will carry on as usual.

Thanks to the beautiful weather last Wednesday, all students came together to walk through the community, spreading awareness and hope. It was amazing to see the students in a sea of orange shirts and the support from the community was a beautiful sight to see.



In addition to these activities, our school hosted the Indigenous People's Atlas of Canada floor map where classes were able to interact with different aspects of Indigenous history and geography in Canada, from residentials schools to Treaties, in an interactive way. They also had the opportunity to view powerful images relating to Indigenous history, prompting important class discussions about social justice.



At the end of the week, we invited students to share their personal commitments to Truth and Reconciliation and we invite you to continue these important conversations at home.
