

We would like to remind parents that fees are due on the <u>1st of each</u> month. Please <u>remember</u> to pay the fees on time. Failure to do so will result in your child being <u>removed</u> from the program.


A reminder to lunch program parents - Please let us know in writing when you are allowing your child to go home or to a friend's house for lunch. The safety of your child is our first concern. Students can register for lunch program if parents <u>work</u> or go to <u>school</u>. Please do not **send your child with warm-ups for lunch**.

We ask parents to please go over the lunchroom rules with your children on a regular basis: Our policy follows School Division guidelines. When a child misbehaves the first time, a verbal warning will be given. The second time, a written letter will be sent home. Within this letter it will state that your child will be removed from the Lunch Program. Then you will need to make alternate arrangements for your child. In the event of a serious incident - your child WILL BE REMOVED immediately without warning.

We would like to encourage you not to send soda pop or noodles. <u>Nut and seafood allergies among children are becoming increasingly common; therefore we have a NO NUTS & SEAFOOD policy.</u> We have many other allergies as well, children are not allowed to share or exchange their snacks or lunches.







<u>Snacks</u> are available through the Lunch Program! Proceeds will go towards hot lunches, equipment. **Cost is approximately \$1.00 each**.

Iqaluit is in Nunavut, which is a part of Canada. The houses in Iqaluit are not built on the ground. They are built on wood stilts or stone so the house doesn't tilt. They have tents there. They have to ship food up to Iqaluit, which makes the food cost lots of money. They eat some food that is the same us, but some food is different. They eat seal meat, berries and whale meat. They speak Inuktitut. The school there looks different because the outside looks like a marshmallow. Arctic animals live there, like polar bears, seals, beluga whales, moose, snowy owl, muskox, narwhals and more. At night they have northern lights.
