We would like to remind parents that fees are due on the 1st of each **month.** Please **remember** to pay the fees on time. Failure to do so will result in your child being **removed** from the program.


A reminder to lunch program parents - Please let us know in writing when you are allowing your child to go home or to a friend's house for lunch. The safety of your child is our first concern. Students can register for lunch program if parents work or go to school.

We ask parents to please go over the lunchroom rules with your children on a regular basis: Our policy follows School Division guidelines. When a child misbehaves the first time, a verbal warning will be given. The second time, a written letter will be sent home. Within this letter it will state that your child will be removed from the Lunch Program. Then you will need to make alternate arrangements for your child. In the event of a serious incident - your child WILL BE REMOVED immediately without warning.

We would like to encourage you not to send soda pop or noodles. Nut and seafood allergies among children are becoming increasingly common; therefore we have a NO NUTS & **SEAFOOD policy.** We have many other allergies as well, children are not allowed to share or exchange their snacks or lunches.







**Snacks** are available through the Lunch Program! Proceeds will go towards hot lunches, equipment. Cost is approximately \$1.00 each.



At both of these events, the University of Manitoba's Science Rendezvous Discovery Days and the University of Winnipeg's STEM Days (Science, Engineering and Mathematics), Technology, students learned about science through hands-on exploration, creative activities, experiments, and theatrical spectacles! Magicians revealed the science of card tricks, students created potions, and physicists revealed the mysteries of time and space!

Here are a few snapshots and write-ups about our time spent at both Universities!









### **University of Manitoba**

This month of May all the grade 3-4 classrooms went on a field trip to the University of Manitoba. We spent the day going to different sessions and learned a lot of new things about science and I'm going to tell you all about it.

The first thing we did on our field trip, was watch a scientist show us really fascinating things. He showed us how elephant toothpaste can build up pressure and cause a foam to shoot up into the air. He mixed chemicals together and made color changing water, and he made a glowstick!

Next, we went to the gym to see exhibits. Some of the different exhibits were how to make paper airplanes, how to make a rocket, guess how many jelly beans were in a jar, and my favorite was painting with different liquids. It really surprised me that you could do that!

After that, we went to a coding game about fish and sharks. We had pieces of paper that would tell the shark what to do. It started off confusing for me, but then I got the hang of it.

Lastly, we went to this place that helps our brain. We had balloons tied on our legs and we had to try to dodge kids trying to stomp on them and pop them. They would tell us to stop and breathe every minute or so. At the end we got to sign our names on a banner.

I loved this field trip! I learned so many new cool things about science and saw some terrific experiments. I would love to go to the University of Manitoba again!

### **University of Winnipeg**

Hi, my name is Nala and today I'm going to tell you all about our field trip to the University of Winnipeg STEM Days.

When we got to the University of Winnipeg, my class and I went to a Biology Lab. We had to put on gloves then we talked about germs. The scientist put shaving cream on our hands and we pretended they were germs. Then they showed us how to take off the gloves like doctors and nurses do without getting germs on us. Next, each of us had a petri dish and we put a swab in some lemon juice and wiped the swap on to the jelly stuff that was already in the petri dish. After that, we put the petri dish on a light and it started to turn pink. The last thing we did in the lab was look in a bunch of microscopes and look at different living organisms. It was so cool!

Next, we went to a different building and we did a stem challenge. We used different materials like paper clips, tape, scissors, 2 cups, cottonballs, a toothpick, and popsicle sticks. We had partners for our challenge and we only had 20 minutes to make our structure!. My partners and I put the egg in the cup and then I went to get the tape and taped the other cup. After that, we had to drop the egg off from the balcony. Our egg didn't break so we were one of the winners!

After the Stem Challenge, it was time for lunch. We ate our lunch outside and there was a live band playing music! For lunch we had free hotdogs, and I ended up eating 3 hotdogs! We also got a bag of chips, a granola bar, an orange and a juice box. After we finished eating our lunches we got to run around and play tag with our friends.

Our next activity, after lunch, was about climate control. My class and I were brought to a big gym and learned about the city climate. We got to make our own monsters that could keep us cool because in the summer the climate gets hot. We also had to find a way to keep track of the climate. After our monsters were created we played a game called, 'Would You Rather'. I really enjoyed it!

Lastly, we went to a chemistry magic show where we got to watch scientists do magic tricks. We saw a barrier filled with steam and when the scientists hit the barrier, steam came out. Then the scientists got a blue balloon and put the balloon on the laser. The balloon didn't end up popping from the laser because the laser was also blue. So then the scientists put a red balloon on the laser and the red balloon actually popped! There were other magic tricks, but I can't remember them all.

I had an amazing time at the University of Winnipeg! I learnt so many new things. I hope I get to go there again next year!
