Field Trip with Rooms 5 and 8 to the Children's Museum. Students will need a bagged lunch and drink.



Happy New Year and welcome 2024! A new year brings about opportunities for changes and New Year's resolutions. This is an exciting time, but also a time to get down to business. These next few months are often some of the busiest at school. We are getting back to routine after a holiday and lots of learning will be taking place.

Goal setting is an important process for children to go through for many reasons:

• Goals help students feel focussed. Learning can sometimes feel overwhelming, especially when multiple subjects and projects are on the go. Having goals can help students narrow their focus and concentrate on a few really important things, except for all of the things.

• They help students measure progress. Students have targets and they know what they are to do and why. Keeping track of progress helps build confidence and can teach children to identify areas of strength and next steps.

• Goals build accountability. When students set their own goals and track progress, this enables them to take ownership for their learning. It also helps them to develop skills of planning, organization and time-management, and organization skills.

• Goals build motivation. When positive outcomes are reached and accomplishments are met, there are a million reasons to celebrate. Students become more confident and feel genuinely good about what they have achieved.

At school, students will be setting goals over the next few months and be reevaluating them on a regular basis. Try setting a goal or two at home too. Examples might be, read ten minutes every night or play a family game three times per week. See what happens!
