We have had a great start this year and we have worked hard to get to know your child's strengths and stretches. Report Cards go home on November 15th. Parent Conferences will be on November 16th from 4:00-7:30 pm as well as the morning of November 17th. School is closed in the afternoon as teachers will be partaking in professional development where we will be enhancing our classroom libraries for students! During conferences, teachers will share with you how your child is doing in the Core subjects of Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies as well as in Physical Education and Music.

If your child is one year or more below grade level, you will see an ND (Not Demonstrating) on the report card. If you see this ND the teacher will provide an Academic Learning Plan (ALP) with the goal of assisting your child to advance in these skills. The ALP will be discussed at length during the Parent Teacher Conferences. If a "1" is shown on the report card, this means that your child is accessing only about 50% of the curriculum for their grade level. In this case, a teacher will discuss an Adapted Education Plan (AEP). This plan will highlight adaptations that the teacher and your child will be working on to assist them in accessing the curriculum more effectively. Any questions regarding either of these plans please reach out to your child's teacher or myself.

November brings colder weather so please help your child to take responsibility for dressing appropriately for the walk to and from school and outdoor recess. Also please insist that your child/ren cross the street only at Patrol Controlled crossings. We want all students to be safe from harm at Weston School.

It's already November!



Thank you to those that have paid the \$45 for school supplies and sent in Kleenex boxes for the classroom.




News from First Grade in Room 6




Adventures with Room 7 and Mr. Storey

Representing Math in Multiple Ways

In October, students in Room 7 have been learning how to represent numbers in multiple ways. We started with using base 10 blocks to build numbers and then moved on to counters and cuisinaire rods. Math is always more fun when we can use manipulatives to show our learning. Kids love to build things, and math just starts to make more sense when we can see our numbers in a physical form in front of us. Grade 2's have been working on representing 2 digit numbers, and grade 3's have been representing 3 digit numbers.

So, where will this lead us? We are beginning to use our knowledge of building numbers to solve addition and subtraction problems. For subtraction we are using cuisinaire rods to show how there is a total that can be broken into parts. Using these parts we can show the numbers that we know and then solve for the part that is unknown in order to find the answer to the problem. For addition we have used base 10 blocks to show how two numbers can be added together to make a larger number.

Fall Season had started and it's getting colder. Make sure that our students are properly dressed in going to school for they need to go out during recess. We also encourage our students to be in school everyday to get the most of their learning.

These past two months, we witness how our students work together as one family. They share ideas and thinking during our vertical learning in Math where they solve problems involving addition and subtraction. This process will be carried on as we continue learning fractions, multiplication and division. We will also enhance our skills in using the open number line, Cuisenaire rods, base 10 blocks and different ways in understanding, representing and demonstrating numbers.

In Science, our students had fun in doing their research about the bearded dragons. They have lots of wonderings about this reptile that could be a good pet for them. As we go on this November, we will continue doing experiments and investigations as regards to buildings and structures. We will make use of the STEAM lab to harness our creativity in building structures. Who knows, one, two or three of our students will become engineers someday. In Health, we talk about how to be safe in and outside the school.


Room 14 - Ms. Massey

We took part in our first family groupings activity on this day, viewing the Orange Shirt Story with students from various grades within our own groups and telling a bit about ourselves within a Sharing Circle. This was followed with a coming together of our entire Weston family over some stew and Bannock.



Students in room 14 are becoming mathematicians! We are building our understanding each day of mathematical concepts playing and exploring with Cuisenaire rods. Students can build and construct whole numbers and fractions in various ways using these visual manipulatives. When we get to play, math is fun, time flies and we don't even realize all the math learning that is taking place.



Finally, room 14 is excited to be able to have access to all the wonderful materials that have been supplied to our STEAM room through the Young Designers program. Students will have the rest of the year to explore with these materials and take their learning to the next level. Stay tuned for the presentation of our first big STEAM project to be tied in with our learning about Habitats and Communities!

In October, students learnt to represent numbers such as improper fractions, mixed numbers, and decimals in different ways using concrete materials like Cuisenaire rods, blocks, counters, chips, egg cartoons. They showed these numbers pictorially using open number lines, bar models, ABC models then wrote them in number sentences. In ELA, we were doing novel study "Wonder" and generating writing ideas with strategies like the first time, the last time, or the time we did something.



A Note from Ms. Bogan

During the last month, I have been working with students on identifying feelings and using the Zones of Regulation. This is a program that helps students to identify how they are feeling and how to return to a regulated and ready -to -learn state. In this program, feelings are sorted into 4 colours (red, yellow, blue and green). It is always our goal to be in the green zone, or focussed, calm and happy. If we are in the red zone, we are feeling angry, panicked or scared. If we are in the yellow zone, we are feeling very silly, frustrated or worried. The blue zone is where we feel tired, sick, sad or bored. The goal of the Zones program is to help students use strategies to return to the green zone. One of many ways we help at school is by offering students an action space and a calming space to be used depending on how they are feeling.



There are things that you can do at home to support Zones of Regulation: - Identify your own feelings using Zones language in front of your child (e.g.: I'm angry. I think I am in the Red Zone.")

- Talk about what tool you will use to be in the appropriate Zone (e.g.: "I need to take four deep breaths to help get me back to the Green Zone.")
- Teach your child which tools they can use. (eg: "It's time for bed. Let's read a book together on the couch to get you back into the Green Zone.")
 - Check in regularly "How are you feeling now?" "How can you get back to Green?"

 Modelling It is important to remember to show children how you use tools to get back to the green zones. You might say "I am going to make myself a cup of tea and do some breathing exercises because I am in the blue zone" and afterwards tell your child how using those tools helped you get back to the green zone. This work will continue throughout the school year.
