
#### Math

Over the next month, they will reflect on a crucial question as we consider what makes us unique, our connection to the community, and where we are going. That question is: Who am I?"



# Welcome back to school !

Hi! My name is Ms. Vo and I am your child classroom teacher this school year in room 15. I hope you and your family had a nice summer. I am very happy to have your son in my class. I am married and a mom of 2 sons who are 16 and 7. I like to travel and listen to music. I also like to cook for my family.

In the month of September, the students in room 15 got to know each other through "Find the person who" and "All About Me" activities. We started our school day with our Sharing Circle in which we told about our feelings and shared things that we would like our classmates to know more about us. We did experiments about electricity and located the provinces and territories and their capital cities on a Canada Map. We began to do book report about the stories that were either read aloud or by ourselves. Graphic organizers are used to generate and organize ideas in writing. Cuisenaire rods, open number lines, part(s)-whole boxes were the tool and the models being used every math class. In health, we learnt about consent and practiced Zones of Regulation.
