Acknowledgement and Commitment to Action

The Commitment to Action for Winnipeg School Division was a collaborative effort amongst students, staff, and community to acknowledge the traditional territory, the treaty relationship, as well as the original people of Turtle Island. The intent of this statement is to begin with acknowledgement, to provoke learning, and to work towards building relationships and reconciliation through a commitment to action. The process was overseen by the guidance of Grandmothers and Grandfathers. A vision was requested through the passing of tobacco, and sealed in ceremony. **The WSD Acknowledgement & Commitment to Action is grounded in Treaty Education and therefore a Support Document and Treaty Education Training opportunity accompanies the unveiling of this statement for all schools to access. This learning will assist all students, staff, and communities within WSD to enter into understanding, empathy, and action towards reconciliation.**

The following statement will be read at the beginning of each school day. To support growth and understanding we will discuss as a staff, embed in classroom learning, and share with community. Tobacco was passed and accepted for this acknowledgement to be read as written. We are developing our commitment extension to the statement and will share once completed.

If your child currently attends William Whyte Community School in grades Nursery to grade seven, there is no need to register for next year. Your child will be placed in a class in the next grade.

Resident Students

Nursery School: If you have a child who was born in 2019, you can register your child for our Nursery school program for the 2023-2024 school year. Children going into Kindergarten to Grade 8 who are new to the neighborhood can also register for school starting on February 15.

To register, please fill out the <u>Student Application</u> <u>for Registration</u> (LINK) form. Please bring the form to the school, or scan and email it. To complete a student's registration, the following documents are required:



- Birth certificate
- Manitoba Medical Card (or other medical insurance)
- Proof of residence (e.g., copy of lease or mortgage agreement)

Non-Resident Students:

Even if you are not a resident of our catchment area, you may apply to come to William Whyte. The principal will determine whether there is space available after resident students are given priority.
