Message from the Principal and Vice Principal

This month we celebrate reading and the joy it brings. *I Love to Read* is a yearly celebration of literacy. This year's theme is "**Stories Connect Us**". We can feel more connected to the world around us by sharing our own stories and listening to the stories of others. Throughout this month, students will engage in classroom and school-wide activities that will encourage both reading and writing.

Recently, the Manitoba Department of Education has launched a campaign to highlight the importance of school attendance. Good attendance at school means missing no more than 10%. However, even two days a month adds up to missing a month of school. Children who attend regularly develop confidence in themselves as learners and develop social skills to form positive friendships. Together, we can help children acquire the skills needed for future educational opportunities and careers.

Starting February 15th, we will begin accepting pre-registrations for the 2023-2024 nursery and kindergarten programs. Children who were born in 2019 can register for Nursery and children born in 2018 can register for Kindergarten. If your child already attends William Whyte, there is no need to re-register for the fall.

We wish everyone a safe and healthy February!



Zaagi'idiwin—Love: Voices of the Elders

The grandfather teaching for the month of February is LOVE. According to Ojibwe knowledge keeper Edward Benton-Benai, love is one of hardest Midewiwin teachings to demonstrate, especially if we are hurt. He says "To know Love is to know peace."

Being able to demonstrate love means that we must first love ourselves before we can show love to someone else. Love is unconditional; it must be given freely. Those who are able to demonstrate love in this way are at peace with themselves. When we give love freely it comes back to us. In this way love is mutual and reciprocal.

According to the Ojibwe dictionary, the work zaagi'idiwin means mutual love.

Lunch Program News

The Winnipeg School Division Board of Trustees has recently released a draft of new policy guiding lunch programs. In order for our school to continue to offer a lunch program during the 2023-2024 school year, we will be introducing a fee next fall. The fees will be used to hire a lunch program coordinator and staff to supervise children. Students will continue to bring their own lunch to school.

Here are the *proposed* fees for next year:

- \$25 per child per month (Full 10-month payment of \$250; or Two installments of \$125 are options)
- \$65 for a family with three or more children
- \$2.00 per day for occasional program user

Fees can be paid at the beginning of the year for the whole year, half a year, or month-by-month. In order for families to establish and maintain their spot in the program, the fees will need to be paid in advance.

We will begin registration for the lunch program in June of this year. In order to determine staffing needs and hire supervisors, we ask that parents *apply* by **June 16**th for next year's lunch program; fees will be due by **September 6**th, **2023**.

We have received some feedback on this proposal from parents / guardians who attended our advisory meeting. More feedback is welcome.

If your child currently attends William Whyte Community School in grades Nursery to grade seven, there is no need to register for next year. Your child will be placed in a class in the next grade.

Resident Students

Nursery School: If you have a child who was born in 2019, you can register your child for our Nursery school program for the 2023-2024 school year. Children going into Kindergarten to Grade 8 who are new to the neighborhood can also register for school starting on February 15.

To register, please fill out the <u>Student Application</u> <u>for Registration</u> (LINK) form. Please bring the form to the school, or scan and email it. To complete a student's registration, the following documents are required:



- Birth certificate
- Manitoba Medical Card (or other medical insurance)
- Proof of residence (e.g., copy of lease or mortgage agreement)
