These assessments are helpful for the province to collect data about student learning to help guide curriculum development.

Students will have a full day of Science Technology Engineering and Math activities led by the University of Winnipeg staff and students. there will be a wide range of activities for each grade and that each grade will be able to check out 2-3 different sessions such as: Procreate workshops teaching Anishinaabe woodlands style art, a chemistry magic show, animation workshops, dry-ice activities, DNA extractions, rocket launching, Minecraft coding, and possibly a robotics workshop.

Grade 5-8 Music Equals fiddling and keyboarding students will get to show off all their hard work and talents at the Showcase event on May 31. As well the grade 3-4 Sharing Dance students will be performing together on May 10 at the University of Winnipeg. So many wonderful opportunities for our students to celebrate all their talent and hard work they have been doing all year. Spring is such an exciting time of the school year where students get to celebrate all the wonderful learning and fun activities they have shared throughout the year!

Resident Students

Nursery School: If you have a child who was born in 2019, you can register your child for our Nursery school program for the 2023-2024 school year. Children going into Kindergarten to Grade 8 who are new to the neighborhood can also register for school starting on February 15.

To register, please fill out the <u>Student Application</u> <u>for Registration</u> (LINK) form. Please bring the form to the school, or scan and email it. To complete a student's registration, the following documents are required:



- Birth certificate
- Manitoba Medical Card (or other medical insurance)
- Proof of residence (e.g., copy of lease or mortgage agreement)

Non-Resident Students:

Even if you are not a resident of our catchment area, you may apply to come to William Whyte. The principal will determine whether there is space available after resident students are given priority.
