

Mature Student Diploma information:

- ✓ Available to any Manitoba resident 19 years of age or older
- ✓ Equivalent in all respects to a youth diploma
- ✓ Accepted by all post-secondary institutions (with the same admission requirements)
- ✓ Only 8 credits required – Can be earned in as little as 1 year no matter what credits you have
- ✓ Start at your own level, no matter your credit history
- ✓ You can transfer credits previously earned to your Mature Diploma studies



WAEC Offers Many option courses at the 40 Level including:

- Psychology, Law, Indigenous Studies, Family Studies, Art, Global Issues, Physical Education, Physics, Chemistry, and Biology
- A second ELA or Math credit can also count as an option: You could use Essentials Math 40S for graduation, and Applied math 40S as an option credit at the 40 Level, and Essential Math 30S as one of the additional courses.
- Students can also apply for recognition of Languages other than English and French – these can be recognized up to the 40 level through language exams.

Additional information for Post Secondary Admissions:

Almost all University Admissions require five 40S credits. Check admission requirements for programs you are interested in pursuing. These additional 40S credits count as additional courses for the mature student diploma. A second English Language Arts credit is highly recommended for students planning to attend post-secondary studies.
