Room 3 Grades 2/3...

Wow can you believe it's already June. This year has flown by. We are ready for summer break.

Last month we finished up our Viking unit and visited the Scandinavian Centre to participate in their Viking School program. The students had an incredible time. They were engaged, asked questions and enjoyed every minute of it. They learned about the tools, homes, food, weaving and clothes making, ships, and made neat stone necklaces with their names written in Runes. They even got to try on some Viking fighting gear.

We started narrative writing, creating stories about Viking gods and goddesses that we learned about. We are still working on this project but the students are coming up with some great ideas and stories. The students are excited to turn these into their own published books and share with each other.

We are moving into Materials and Structures in science. This will be our final unit of the year and the students seem very excited for it. We will be exploring a building challenge during this unit. If there are any families that have spare building supplies (sticks, boxes, straws, etc.) we welcome any donations.

There is still a lot learning to do this month and we will make the most of it the few days we have left.







Room 10 Grades 3/4...

The month of May was filled with adventure...of the fictional kind. Each student wrote a short story. They were tasked with developing a story that had a clear beginning, middle and end. They needed to include dialogue with quotation marks. They learned about elements of descriptive language including adverbs, adjectives, strong verbs and interesting words to replace said. They explored writing with figures of speech like similes and onomatopoeia. The students shared their stories with the class, and special guest, Clare! Then we looked at informational comics created by Kaj Hasselriis. The students were asked to find an interesting article on CBC Kids News. Then they summarized the story in a news comic of their own making.

We sowed marigold seeds for the School Peace Garden with our Nursery/Kindergarten buddies. We started our unit on soils and will be designing experiments investigating variables that impact plant growth.





Room 8 Grades 4/5...

Hello! We are the students of room 8. We have been working on math posters. The criteria was to create 3 word problems that created a story. We also drew pictures to show what our topic was about. At the end, we will present the posters we made. Not sure to who, it hasn't happened yet as of us writing this. Everybody has worked hard on this big project, and we are all very proud of them.

In spelling, certain students wrote paragraphs about different things, and certain students covered up words that they already knew and practiced words that they didn't know. The people who are doing paragraphs have written about different things that they preferred over others. Everybody has worked hard on spelling, and they are all getting better each day.

This month, we did something called AAC. AAC stands for augmentative alternative communication. We learned about how different people might communicate differently. The last time we did AAC, we went to the gym and did 5 different stations. At these stations, we learned about how people who were missing one of their 5 senses communicate with other people. We used communication boards, iPads, sign language, and others. We all had fun, and everybody loved the snack station! From the students of Room 8, Simon, Hunter, Emma and Mekhi.





Room 9 Grades 5/6...

It's hard to believe that the school year is almost over. We've been hard at work in Room 9 with some new and continuing work and projects. Our student teacher, Alysa, has now finished her teaching block, and we wrapped up the election learning we were doing with her, but have continued to focus on weather, patterns and algebra and our story writing.

We've spent the last couple of months writing stories following the hero's journey, and we have finally completed them! Students wrote full stories, some of them even reaching 50 typed pages, and they have been sent off to a professional printing company. The books will come with a front cover and blurb made by the students as well.

We've started talking about algebra in math and will soon be learning about the order of operations. Our science unit is continuing with more learning around weather. We have talked about the difference between weather and climate, the properties of air and will soon be talking about extreme weather.

Now that the election is over, we have shifted from our student vote back into our interactive notebooks. We're now getting closer to Canada's confederation in our timeline and have just finished learning about the Seven Year's War and the Red River Settlement.

June is going to bring a lot of fun, end-of-theyear events for our classroom. It's going to be a busy month. We have patrol events, camp and much more coming up very soon. If you want to see what we're doing in Room 9, you can check out our Instagram (@wolseley9).



Room 13 Grades 5/6 ...

Here are some highlights of what we are doing in room 13:

In science we have been working on a weather unit - doing inquiry based projects to make our own weather devices like Barometer, wind vane, rain gauge etc. Researching about different types of clouds, severe weather and how it impacts on humans and animals.

In math we are learning about Shapes and Space including - Angles,2D-3D shapes, Perimeter, area, and volume.


In ELA we are learning about different forms of poetry like Acrostic Poetry, Alliteration Poetry and Haiku Poetry. We did TUSC this month. We are also spending a lot time outside for reading time. We are reading aloud a novel named "Wonder".

For Art we did Scratch Art and Optical Illusion art.

In Social Studies we have learnt about the different types and levels of Government around the World and in Canada.

Election processes, how candidates are elected, voting, different parties' election agendas. Different ridings in Winnipeg, and we held a Student Vote on Election Day.

We learned how to write official letters to any authorized person.

It was wonderful to return to the performing arts room in May! What a warm welcome I received! After a week of drama games and activities, the students have begun a drum unit with the djembes and tubanos. They are practicing echoing, creating, and playing a variety of rhythms, as well as playing as an ensemble balancing multiple rhythms. Our Djembe unit will take us into June and we will transition to learning some Indigenous music during our outdoor challenge.

Six of our grade 6 students had the opportunity to attend the elementary choral celebration on May 20th where they learned three songs with a guest conductor and sang with 117 other students from across WSD. The day was full of music learning and creating community within our division. Our students sang beautifully!
