

And in Art the students are learning new techniques in drawing and sketching to create artwork.

Room 3 Grade 2/3 ...

Room 3 is growing a garden in our classroom! We were generously borrowed an AeroGarden by a family from our classroom. We planted a bunch of different types of lettuce and one herb, basil. This was a learning experience for all of us and one that we have really enjoyed. Students have taken responsibility for the care of the garden, reading the instructions, adding the water and nutrients. There was so much excitement when our plants started to sprout! We have had lots of rich discussions about what has been happening in our classroom garden, for instance what is making them grow and lots of talk about the intricate system of roots in the bottom. Most of the room 3 students also ate a leaf off of our basil plant, and said it was really yummy! We are now planning and preparing to harvest our lettuce and discussing ways we can eat it! The growing of our garden happens to go really well with our plant unit we are currently working on!

Room 8 Grade 3/4 ...

Greetings from Room 8!

For a short month, we accomplished a lot! For I Love to Read month, we had a break from Graphic Novels and read Novels. We challenged ourselves to read novels that Janet hand picked for us. For the most part she did a good job choosing books for the students. We did a fraction of our Math learning, understanding fractions and have begun to tackle multiplication and division. We are in the process of creating sugar crystals in our study of rocks to see how they are formed and the shapes they create. Once we have completed this scientific inquiry, we will eat them! In Social Studies we are studying Ancient Civilizations. It is amazing how many things we have today that began in Ancient Times! We will be demonstrating our learning through the creation of an artifact and a dramatization. This curious group of learners continues to thrive and strive!

Room 10 Grade 3/4 ...

Students are busy building structures related to our study of Ancient Egypt. The dioramas depict the everyday life of a farmer, a villa that could have been owned by a wealthy merchant, different boats as well as a pyramid, tomb with a mummy, and temple. We dehydrated apples, to observe how removing water from fruit preserves it. Students also made a cartouche with their own name written in hieroglyphics. We are excited to celebrate our learning by holding Shops' Day, Ancient Egyptian style, at the end of March.







Room 9 Grade 5/6 ...

This month has been a busy one in Room 9. Students have been building electrical circuits using wires, batteries and a variety of different outputs. We've spent a few weeks talking about a bunch of different topics involving electricity and now the students are putting all their knowledge to good use. We've also spent time learning about World War I, early immigration to Canada and the 1919 General Strike.

Our class has been reading Hidden on the Highwire by Kathy Kacer and just finished the book as February ended. Students have also been participating in book clubs where they read and discuss different books to work on their ability to read between the lines and talk about their reading. It's been an I Love to Read month full of a lot of reading. In math we have focused on everyone's favourite skill, long division. We have now moved into talking about positive and negative integers and will be using all of the skills we've learned so far this year when we start using the order of operations.

There was lots going on during February with I Love to Read month and Black history and futures month. March is looking like another busy month as we head towards spring break. Room 13 Grade 5/6 ...

This month in room 13 was GREAT! We began writing our dnd dungeons. First, we wrote them on paper, then typed them out. Our plan is to play each others awesome dungeons. That was a neat way for each student to share their creative ideas through storytelling! That's what we did for E.L.A this month. Secondly, science. We started our new unit for science about electricity and circuits. We started off by learning about static electricity and how electricity can be in thermal, sound, light, static and current form. It was pretty cool to learn how electricity can power our daily needs! Plus, we learned how you can create power in innovative ways, and we learned how to deal with electricity safely.

Now for social studies! In our interactive notebooks we unfortunately missed two weeks because of Valentines day, Louis Riel day and an in-service day. But that doesn't mean we didn't do it at all, we learned about WW1 and WW2. Some of our room 13 students made a short film of the events that occurred in WW1!




This time in math we started long division and we had a math TEST. Our Grade 7 math book people continued their kangaroo math and we got good at our mental math strategies. Plus our stressful speed math tests. But that has quite pushed our math skills to be better and we have definitely improved in our multiplication facts.

s we should all know it was black history month, plus "I love to read month!" Sean has been reading a

book to the class called, Maya and the Rise of Dark. This book is amazing! It's about African mythology! It's really good! This book is by a black author named Rena Barron.

Finally, VALENTINES DAY!! This Valentines day we had a super fun game day! We got to bring games in and a few kind students made treats and we ate them in the library. *DELICIOUS!*

Room 17am Nursery/Kindergarten...

I think I blinked and February was over! I'm glad I take so many pictures to capture the learning each month!

Room 17 has been working a lot with words - finding them within text, writing them by sounds, building them with magnetic letters, etc. Our "We Can Read" board is coming along! Thank you for continuing to send them labels in. Students are practicing reading some of the labels like Hot Wheels, Bear Paws, and Tim Hortons. We also started Home Reading this month, and I hope students are enjoying it. Reminder that book bags come back every Monday for book swap. We will continue to build our letter and word bank. On Valentine's Day we had a fun scavenger hunt where students had to find heart halves, and find it's matching uppercase or lowercase partner and they had a blast, especially when they realized that someone else already had their matching half! We also enjoyed some I Love to Read activities with our Learning Buddies, including making book marks.



Students have also taken ownership of the daily question in regards to number sense. Each day, one student will come up to the board and point to each name in the columns for the rest of the class to count. Then they write the corresponding numbers, and circle the larger one. We are also building our number skills through the daily counting collections. New collections get added frequently to keep everyone engaged.

We used our critical thinking skills with a fun science experiment and made decisions about whether candy hearts would float or sink in regular tap water, and carbonated water. Of course we got to eat some too!

Our Sources of Strength lessons have included writing down our Aha moments (trying/accomplishing something new or difficult), and Affirmations (appreciations for others) on a paper chain. It is continually growing! We will see how long it is by the end of the year!

This month has been all about hearts, love, learning about rabbits, and preparing for our pretend trip to Costa Rica for the month of March!








