Room 3 Grade 2/3 ...

December continued to be a busy month in our classroom! We have been working hard comparing and contrasting fairy tales and with their fractured fairy tales. We have also spent time examining and discussing the structure of these stories in order to prepare them to write their own fractured fairy tales in the New Year!

We have also done a few S.T.E.A.M activities with our buddies and within the classroom. The students were challenged to make an ornament out of nuts, bolts, washers, and pipe cleaners. They couldn't use any other materials or tools and their ornaments had to meet specific criteria. They also had an opportunity to create a skit based on a fairy tale with their older buddies in Room 13. They then had to preform it and the others had to guess which fairy tale. They were a lot of fun to watch!

December also marked the ending of our Genius Hour projects with Ms Glynnis. Each student had the opportunity to pick an area of interest and develop a question and then research or create something depending on their chosen question. They then had to choose how they were going to present their project to the class. Some chose a Google slide show, board games, poster, or a video game. Every student did an amazing job and demonstrated a lot of courage by getting up in front of their classmates and presenting!

Room 8 Grade 3/4 ...

In Room 8 we have been studying the Geography of Canada. We have learned directions, studied provinces, territories, capital cities, major bodies of water and provincial flags. To demonstrate the different geographic regions of Canada, we baked a Cake of Canada. Yes, we baked ten cakes, and put them together with a rice krispie Hudson's Bay. It took 22 students, 3 EA's, a parent volunteer, a student teacher and a teacher 5 hours to decorate and put the cakes together! The finished product was delicious and educational!

Room 10 Grade 3/4 ...

During December (the darkest month of the year) students learned about the properties of Light, with the help of Sim Singh, the teacher candidate working with Room 10. Students had fun bouncing and bending light using mirrors, prisms and other transparent materials such as glass and water. Students wrote their own quiz questions, which were compiled into a class Kahoot, testing their knowledge on the Unit.

Kaj Hasselriis, a guest author, visited the students in Rooms 10 and 8 and showed us the News Comic for kids he writes. He explained the process he goes through to create them. Students then explored the CBC Kids News site and chose a Hot Topic to read about and then developed their own News Comics.

Students explored fractions and decimal numbers and how they relate to money. Knowing the coins and their values, adding totals and calculating correct change are important skills they will need for Shops Day in Room 10, coming up in February. They continue to practice strategies to solve multiplication problems efficiently with the goal of memorizing basic facts.

We celebrated the end of the month by playing board games. Students suggested starting a noon hour board game club...stay tuned!







Room 9 Grade 5/6 ...

We've continued working in our Interactive Notebooks in social studies and have spent time learning about the creation of the North West Mounted Police, residential schools, the gold rush and the building of the Canadian Pacific Railway.

We've been doing a lot of work involving multiplication in our room. Our room does a lot of collaborative work for math where we solve problems in small random groups and then discuss our thinking so that we can learn to talk about math and not just follow a pattern all the time. We've been doing a lot of this lately and have even showed off our skills to some other teachers in December.

In January we'll move on and start focusing on division and other math concepts. We also finally wrapped up our personal memoirs, or ouch stories, about a time where we got injured. We went through a whole writer's workshop process to get to the publishing phase and now our writing is on display in the hallway for everyone to read.

One other project we have been working on is our Genius Hour projects. Ms. Glynnis has been working with us a few times each week to do research on a topic of our choosing. These topics are things we are passionate about and that we want to learn more about. Students have been working hard for the last month and a half on research and creating a presentation about their topics and now we are finally getting to the finish line as December comes to a close. The presentations so far have been great, and it has been fun to see students sharing their interests in an intentional way.

Room 13 Grade 5/6 ...
