Dear Wolseley Families,

What a great September! Our students and staff have had a great start to the school year. Way to go Wolseley Wolves!

This year we had our Meet the Teacher on September 11th. I hope you all enjoyed meeting our staff and seeing the inside of our school and classrooms. We sure enjoyed having you!

On September 26th our school participated in Orange T-Shirt Day, as we now are observing September 30th as a national day for Truth and Reconciliation. We had an assembly where we learned about Orange T Shirt Day, learned sign language for our land acknowledgement, Sang a whole school song in Ojibway, and we wore orange and walked in the neighbourhood in recognition of the harm residential schools had on children and to express the message that everyone around us matters. Thanks for the overwhelming support!

Our Wolseley beliefs are: Be Respectful, Be Responsible and Be Safe. These beliefs help guide students when they are at school so they can learn and interact with others in a healthy, positive way.

Please remember to call the school office to report any absences for your children. At Wolseley School the bell rings at 8:55 am for students to enter the building before school starts at 9:00 am. Please do not send your children too early as there is no supervision outside until 8:45 am. After lunch, the bell rings at 12:55 pm for students to enter the building so teachers can resume class at 1:00 pm. Any late students are to sign-in in the office before going to class. Please make sure your child(ren) arrive on time to class to avoid interruptions to learning.

Teachers in grade 1-6 have begun to conduct elementary assessments. This assessment assists teachers in planning next steps for learning to meet the individual needs of each student.

Reading, writing, math, physical education and social emotional skills are the areas assessed. Teachers use the information they learn about students during this process to program for them and plan targeted reading, spelling and math groups, as well as to identify challenges and learning gaps.

We are off to a great start to the year! May October be an amazing learning month!

Room1 Grades 1/2...

Room one is off to a flying start! Students are learning the routines of our classroom and learning to collaborate with one another.

We have been busy learning about our number of the day and centers in math.

We have been practicing phonics and exploring poems, songs and stories to build our love of literature. Students have been practicing printing and have been writing daily.

In Science we have been working together, asking questions and learning about birds.





Room 2 Grades 1/2...

We made our own 'Magical Yets' and we made a class 'Magical Yet.' These Magical Yets help us to try and learn new things. Instead of saying "I can't do it," we say "I can't do it yet."

At the end of every day we listen to a chapter book. Right now we're listening to "The Fabled Stables: Willa the Wisp" by Jonathan Auxier and this book gave us the idea to create our own creatures by putting different animals or things (like plants) together.

We're also learning how to read.

We have been learning about the sun or reviewing what we know, and we made an art piece showing a scene in the day and the night. Soon we will do some shadow experiments.

In math we have been making lots of patterns using blocks, little bears, our bodies and more. We are practicing counting by 2s, 5s and 10s.

We've been learning some words in Cree from some of Julie Flett's books. 'Kimêtawânaw' means 'we all play' and 'haw êkwa' means 'let's go.'

Lastly, we created a fall display in our classroom and we've been adding things we find in nature, like squash, tomatoes, leaves, pumpkins, flowers and more.

Room 8 is GREAT!!

Hello wonderful parents, we are two students from rm 8. Back to the Newsletter.

Language Arts: We are working on memoirs. Memoirs are like memories as a story. They can be short like a few pages or a whole chapter book. The process is that we started by filling a sheet with the information, after that we made a rough draft of the story. We edit the story, and we add punctuation if we need to. Then eventually the final copy.

Math: We're doing this thin called make a million, which is a game where you roll a dice and write the number. Then you put it in a printed box of our choice. We do this until all the boxes are filled. Then we add the numbers up and whoever's numbers are closest to 1 million wins. We are also working on multiplication (like thousands for grade 4, and hundred thousand for grade 5) and place value. Social Studies: Did you know that we are learning about all of Canada!!!

Isn't that insane? We wrote about provinces and territories.

In this activity, students were tasked with working together in small groups to help Freddy—a gummy worm—who had found himself stranded in the middle of the ocean after his boat (a plastic cup) capsized. The catch? Students could only use paperclips to restore Freddy to safety by getting him back into his candy life preserver. By participating in this challenge, students not only had fun but also developed important collaboration skills, interpersonal skills, and the ability to persevere in the face of a challenge!





Room 9 Gr's 5/6...

It's been a busy first month back at school for the 25/26 school year. We have been setting up all our supplies and subjects, personalizing our classroom and jumping into our learning. This year will see the return of some favourites, like our Interactive Notebooks, as well as some new challenges! If you'd like to see what's going on in our classroom you can check us out on Instagram at @wolseley9. We post about our learning and some of the special things we're doing here in Room 9 pretty regularly.

We've started the year learning about place value in math. We've been working hard, talking about digits and how the place they hold in a number gives them meaning. We've also been playing around with making numbers and learning how to read large numbers properly. We have also been doing a lot of writing to start the year. We're waking everyone's brains up from their summer vacation with some creative, silly and open-ended writing prompts, as well as a weekly editing project to help with our use of punctuation and capitalization. Our Interactive Notebooks are set up for Social Studies and we've started our learning timeline with Canada's confederation. Throughout the year we will move from topic to topic, moving through Canada's history from confederation to the modern day. Our Interactive Notebooks will be like a scrapbook timeline of all of our learning throughout the year. It's a common favourite from past years for both students and teacher as well. In science we will be focusing on flight for the first portion of the school year. We will learn about the forces that make flight possible, some concepts that are integral to flight, and much more.

If you've had a chance to come into the school, you may have seen our pop art in the hallway! Students learned about pop art, pointillism and artists like Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein. They created bright, bold and colourful art pieces in that classic comic book style that is so recognizable.

Finally, this will be the last newsletter you get from me personally for a few months. I'll be gone soon on paternity leave until the beginning of 2026. We're welcoming Alana Carvalho into our school and classroom to take over for the time that I'm away. She'll do a great job leading the class through their learning for the next 2.5 months until Winter Break! See you in the new year! - Riley

Room 13 Gr's 5/6...

This school year was full of growth and memorable moments. We dove into challenging subjects, exciting projects and worked hard to improve our skills.

We did a lot of different things including math patterns like 3- or 4-part patterns, increasing patterns and decreasing patterns. We also started some algebra. For algebra we did n+2= something or like tx3=.

For ELA we did an "I am poem" and some writing about your life. We also talking about adding more details to our sentences and word choice.

For science we did a planet project where each group has to study a planet and you have to add if there is a ring around it and what color it is, is it solid or gas, how many moons are around the planet, is the planet made of gas or is it solid and how heavy it is.

For S.S. we learned about the B.N.A. act, we had to do a news article explaining what it was and why it was important.

The criteria are to write a headline (short and to the point)

Write 1-2 paragraphs (4-5 sentences each) that explain the including: who what, when, where, why and how. Include a photograph (printed or drawn) and include a caption for it describing what it shows.

We learned about Orange Shirt day and we talked about the Residential Schools and about Truth and Reconciliation Day and how, when, and why it was made.

We also did spelling. We have different groups like red, blue and green. For spelling we did seeing if words have s' at the end or ies' or es'.

And all your work must be done by Friday, if it isn't you don't get to go on computers or play board games.

Room 19 Performing Arts/Dance...

We jumped right into Performing Arts with get to know you games, building our community, and reviving our culture of creativity. Students learned the song; "We Are One Love" by Winnipeg composer Syliva Wastesicoot. Sylvia is an Indigenous Education Support teacher from Pembina Trails who gifted this song to me to teach our students. She lives in Winnipeg although is from Tataskweyak Cree Nation on Treaty 5 land. Her song teaches the power of relationships, helping remind us we are all interconnected, as people, plants, animals, sun, moon, earth, water and more. We sang this song all together for our Orange Shirt Day assembly on Sept.26th.

In dance, students have already been choreographing while learning concepts of place, direction, and wholebody vs. body isolation movements.

In October, we will move into playing the barred instruments, building our dance vocabulary and practicing our creating and reflecting skills.



French News...

Bonjour! On s'amuse déjà en français à Wolseley! We've had a fun start to French class at Wolseley. Students receive half an hour of French class per cycle. 
