About Harrow School

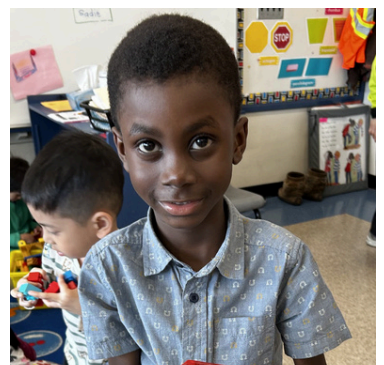
