We also continued to consider our hands and the many amazing things they allow us to do. I 'caught' many fun conversations during play time that included discussions about hands. As a class we talked about how helping is an important thing we use our hands for. It was especially inspiring to hear several students make meaningful connections between our outdoor learning, the learning about hands and our daily conversations about Indigenous knowledge.

When we were creating our Land Acknowledgment, two students shared about how taking care of the land is a good way to make peace. It is so exciting to see the wonderful connections the students make.

December is sure to fly by as we will finish exploring polar bears, have a Winter Concert, start a fun gingerbread exploration and get ready for Winter Break.











GRADE 1 - ROOM 208 | MS. NASSAR

Hi families, I am so happy to be back and teaching the Grade 1 students in Room 208.

The students are making great progress. It was so lovely to meet some of you during the parent teacher conferences, and I look forward to meeting the rest of you soon. We have started to work on our Daily 5 (work with a teacher, read to self, read to someone, work on writing or listen to reading). We are working on our "reading stamina" and trying to reach our goal of 20 minutes of uninterrupted read-to-self time. We will begin reading groups soon.

The students finished their first social studies unit with Ms. Kaur, and we are about halfway through science and learning about the 5 senses.

GRADES 2, 3 - ROOM 209 | MRS. BARROS

Wow! What a fast and exciting month November has been! We began by honouring our veterans on Remembrance Day and learning all about the meaning behind the poppy. Students showed such kindness and thoughtfulness during our discussions, and it was a meaningful way to start the month.

In science, students enjoyed hands-on challenges like building marshmallow bridges, designing chairs for Princess Peach, and experimenting with simple machines. It has been wonderful watching their creativity, teamwork, and problem-solving skills grow.

In math, we've been strengthening our basic facts and working with compatible numbers to 10, 20, and 50. We'll soon be moving on to compatible numbers to 100. To keep practicing at home, Mathletics is a fantastic way to reinforce numeracy skills in a fun and interactive way. Reading Eggs is also a great support for reading development and continues to be a student favourite.

Looking ahead, we're getting ready to "travel around the world" as we explore different holidays, traditions, and celebrations from many cultures. This is always such an exciting unit filled with stories, crafts, and hands-on learning.










PHYSICAL EDUCATION | MS. MCFADYEN
