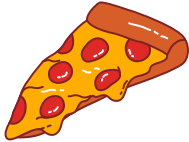

Cash can be paid at the school office.

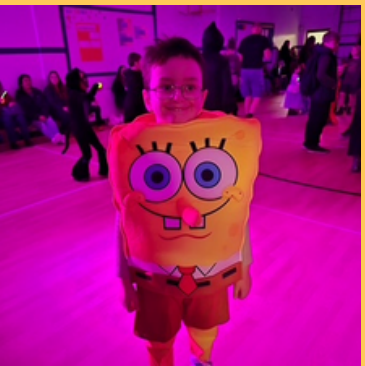

We enjoyed great sunny days in October. October also brought us many exciting learning adventures. Our students have taken to the outdoors for inquiry group learning, nature-based learning and exploration. Intramurals for grades 4 to 6 are well underway. Mr. Park has been teaching students about Tchoukball and Sabakiball. Tchoukball is a no contact game to get everyone moving and playing. In this game, students work together to achieve a goal, which is scoring points and stopping the other team from scoring points. Sabakiball is a five-on-five team sport where one team tries to strike the opposing team goal pin causing it to fall or move off the goal-pin spot. The students are enjoying these new sports. Thank you, Mr. Park.

Kindness Club has started up again thanks to Mrs. Speidel. Our Leadership Club students were busy planning for the PAC Fall Dance and for the Halloween & Non-Halloween celebrations.

The annual Terry Fox Run happened at the beginning of October. Thanks to Mr. Park and the rest of the school staff, students learned about Terry Fox and his legacy to raise awareness for cancer research. This year, we raised \$204.20. Thank you for your continued generous support. Swimming and Bethel Readers have started once again. Thank you to Ms. Etkin and Mrs. Speidel who are taking on these amazing programs to support student learning and engagement.

Assessment is on-going. It happens daily in our classrooms. The focus will continue to be Literacy, Numeracy and support for our students' social-emotional needs. Your voice matters. Reach out if you require further clarification of our assessment practices. Families/guardians play a vital role in supporting their child's learning at home by finding ways and times to help their child practice reading, writing and engaging in numeracy activities daily. One way we support our students' emotional regulation is to help students identify where they are in the zones of regulation. Another way we support our students is by conducting learning opportunities outside (inquiry groups). Play is also a great way to support children's social-emotional needs.

Tri-Conferences will be held on Thursday, November 20th (3:45 pm to 7:00 pm) and on Friday, November 21st (9:00 am to 12:00 pm – only). The afternoon of the 21st will be Professional Development for teachers. Tri conferences refer to conferences led by 3 people – you, your child and the classroom teacher. It is important that your child come to the Tri-Conferences to discuss their learning journey. The scheduling of the Tri-Conferences will be done once again online. A step-by-step on how to book the online meeting will be shared with you before the conferences.

We are happy to provide an interpreter for your child's Tri-Conference. These interpreters are provided at no cost to you. The division looks after the cost. Interpreted Tri-Conferences are scheduled through Mrs. Speidel and may not occur on the 20th or 21st of November as the interpreters support all other schools in the WSD. Coats for Kids will once again happen at the school.
