Dear Prairie Rose Families,







coming up this month

NURSERY, KINDERGARTEN - ROOM 113 (AM) | MS. D

Wow! The month of October seemed to go by in a flash, as we were extremely busy putting the finishing touches on our Fall Tree Artwork and creating our Turkeys. We also enjoyed our explorations of Spiders, Pumpkin carving, and our fun-filled Halloween celebration! Thank you to all of our families who helped us with our costumes, pumpkin designs and treats!

This month, we will continue to work on many of the skills from last month and introduce many new ones, in the areas of Language Arts and Mathematics, as we explore the topics of Remembrance Day (with a focus on the importance of Peace and why we wear a Poppy), Winter and Polar Bears. We are also going to continue our study of the alphabet (letter recognition and sounds), printing and rhyming.

Initial assessments have been completed and report cards will be sent home on Tuesday, November 18th, followed by Parent-Teacher Interviews on Thursday evening, November 20th and Friday (in the Morning only), November 21st. You will be receiving an interview request form shortly. When you receive your appointment time, please make sure to mark it on your calendars. NURSERY, KINDERGARTEN - ROOM 113 (PM) | MS. WELTY

October has brought cooler weather and lots of leaves on the ground. This month students went for several walks hunting for different colours and shapes of leaves, counting trees and worms along the way. We are working hard to practice our best manners by saying please and thank you, waiting our turn (even when it is hard) and considering what it would be like to spread kindness wherever we go. This month students were introduced to a movement activity the uses music and a visual prompt to encourage prewriting as well as emotional regulation. If you are interested in seeing an example, you can go on YouTube and search "Symphony No. 5 Scarf Tracing Video". Our class is truly a sweet group of children, and it has been especially lovely to see how welcoming and thoughtful they are to any student who may be having a hard moment or even day. Even at such young ages these children are so inspiring.

We have been playing several games which focus on subitizing (reading the faces of dice) and connecting the amounts to the standard numeral. Students are getting pretty good at this. I'd encourage families to play board games that use dice and counting. It is a fun way to connect with children and sneak in some math too!

Next month, we will continue to learn about love and courage and we will add humility to the conversation. We will do lots of patterning activities, dig deeper into trees (literally considering root systems) and we will consider what makes each of us unique and what types of things are the same about all of us. Look for our "All About Me" project in mid to late November! It will be so fun.

I am looking forward to meeting with as many of you and your students as possible. It will be a nice time to let your students show off some of their work and spend time encouraging them in their next steps this school year.













GRADE 1 - ROOM 208 | MS. KAUR



In Room 208 we love learning. We have been working really hard, and students are doing their best to learn something new.

In math, we are working on counting by 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's forward and have started backward counting this month. Thank you for practicing counting with your child at home by asking some questions related to counting forward and backward; it has helped a lot. Students are enjoying Mathletics, an online math tool and games, as extra math practice in fluency. The students are completing a minimum of 5 lessons per week!!

Grade 1s really love art! We have done several art projects to display. Please come and see what we have displayed in this month's showcase for November. You can view it at the front foyer and you can see it right when you walk in. Students did an abstract art for this project. We also did art activities related to a Halloween theme.

In Science and Social Studies, we are working in our Interactive Journal for each subject. Our first unit is The Five Senses for Science. In Social Studies, we started working on the unit named *We Belong*.

In Daily 5 we have been practicing our silent reading, writing about what they draw and sight words. We have started using an online tool, Reading Eggs, too. They started taking library books home to practice reading at home. Please ensure to send the bag back every day as we use them in class reading.



GRADES 2, 3 - ROOM 209 | MRS. BARROS

Wow—October was a fun and busy month in our classroom! We got creative with Fall crafts, making colourful Romero Britto-inspired pumpkins using paint and oil pastels. Carving and painting pumpkins was a blast—we even got delightfully messy! Counting all those pumpkin seeds was a math adventure, and the very best part? Tasting them, of course!

In math, we've all become place value pros! We've been rounding numbers to 100 and using our skills to solve number puzzles like true mathematicians. Last week, we dove into Canadian geography, learning all about provinces and capital cities. The students worked hard and had fun exploring our amazing country.

Science has been equally exciting as we explored Structures and Materials. We experimented with building stable and unstable structures, learned new vocabulary, and discovered how materials affect what we can build. Collaborating with our friends in Room 214 has made our learning even more fun.

It's been wonderful to see so much curiosity, creativity, and teamwork this month. We can't wait to see what November brings!







GRADES 2, 3 - ROOM 214 | MRS. SIMONS

October was a fun and productive month! In ELA, we have been working on creative and informational writing for the month, writing about different Fall or Halloween topics. We are also continuing with our weekly personal writing, Daily 5 (still building that Read to Self stamina!) and a new classroom novel, *The Mouse and the Motorcycle*. In Math, we focused on Place Value, Mental Math strategies and Patterns. We are wrapping up our first Real Life math project of the year, where students run a candy store. This project has us doing addition, interpreting graphs, skip counting, place value, and working with money. We also started a new online math program called Mathletics.

We finished learning about the different provinces, territories and capital cities of Canada in Social Studies. We recently started a new Science unit learning all about *Materials and Structures*. Students have been doing very well with planning and designing different structures and testing their theories on strength and stability using a variety of materials! We took advantage of the beautiful Fall weather and took Science outside. We went for a community walk for a Structure Hunt which was lots of fun! In art, we worked on Fall, Thanksgiving and Halloween activities. We had lots of fun at the Earth Rangers Presentation, viewing the pumpkin contest entries, our Halloween parade and our class Halloween party. We are looking forward to all the things we get to learn about in November!

It has been another busy month here in Room 215. Here is a look at some of the things we have done.



Through conversations with staff and families, WSD has developed a framework directly connected to our <u>2025-2030</u> <u>Strategic Plan</u> to help our staff think deeply about artificial intelligence. A huge thanks to those families who attended the AI information evening in September at Tec Voc.

The advent of AI, specifically large language models, poses significant challenges, questions, and an uncertain future for learners and our world. As a thinking community, we want all staff and learners to think about the current and future implications of AI use on our species and planet.

Over the next few months, WSD staff will be coming together to interrogate the AI Thinking Framework and develop guidelines and supports for classrooms.
