Music Highlights

January was a wonderful month for music making and learning. Rooms 218, 217 and 215 had a field trip to the Centennial Concert Hart, to watch Charlotte and the Music Maker, performed by the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra. With this experience the children were introduced to the instruments of the orchestra. We have continued this learning through listening, drawing and some hands-on centres.

Recorder work has begun for Rooms 216 and 210. We began this work with learning some music theory about how to name and read notes on a staff. The recorders are provided for the children and will stay at school. If you choose to buy a recorder for home I recommend a recorder that comes apart in 3 pieces for the best quality.

Rooms 205 and 203 began the year with Music Genre Battle! The children learned about 8 different music genres; pop, rock, musical theatre, jazz, classical, EDM and hip hop/rap. The end winner for favourite genre was different for each class. Room 205 chose hip hop/rap as the favourite genre. In a turn of events, Room 203 chose musical theatre! This work is culminating in the opportunity for students to dig into their personal favourite genres as they make their own slide presentation.

On Tuesday, February 3rd, Rooms 216 and 210 will be going to Tec-Voc High School to watch the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra perform with young musicians from a few different schools in WSD. This will include 8 fiddle players from Pinkham School! It's hard to believe these young musicians only began in October!

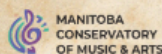

Math Is Full of Fun!

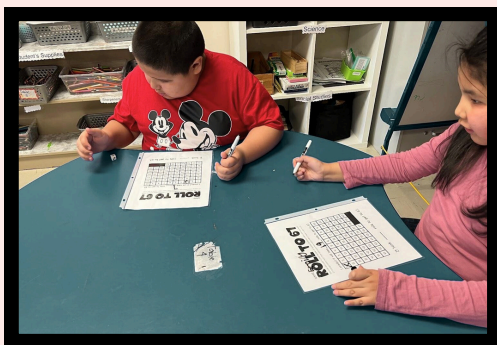
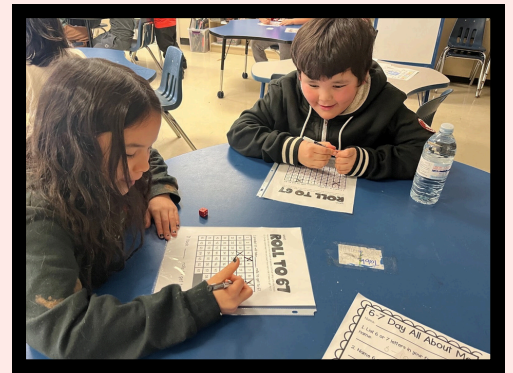

Meals2go – Every student will take home a M2G bag every Friday except N/K a.m. they will receive their bags on Monday mornings as M2G is delivered in the afternoon.

Parent Council Meetings – These meetings are a great way to share school information and meet other Parents/Guardians. We offer free childcare and a light dinner. Our next Parent Council Meeting is on Wednesday, February 25th at 3:45. Please let me know if you are attending to make sure we have enough food.

Beading/sewing – Thursday's are drop in beading/sewing. We started making beaded pins, you can make earrings, dreamcatchers or use the loom to make bracelets. You are welcome to use our sewing machine for a project or bring in any items you have to mend them.

Family After school Pottery on Tuesdays from 3:45 – 5:30. Our first Pottery evening went really well. Our families created bowls, plaques, chop sticks and even a spice mortar, painting them is our next session. Come out and create something special using clay, make a cup, vase or a smudge bowl. One session is creating, letting it dry and firing it in the kiln. In the next session we paint our creation, let it dry then fire in the kiln again. Come with your kids or come by yourself.

Cooking Classes – I will be starting a cooking class this month. I have a couple of ideas such as a "Soup Club" or "Dinner Ideas". We can cook together by sharing recipes or following a new one. What we make together is what you can take home for your family. This is a good way to meet other Parents/Guardians and get new ideas for meals. Please join us on Thursday February 19th for our first cooking class and we can share any food ideas we can do together in the future!

Please note that students in the lunch program are expected to follow all safety rules.

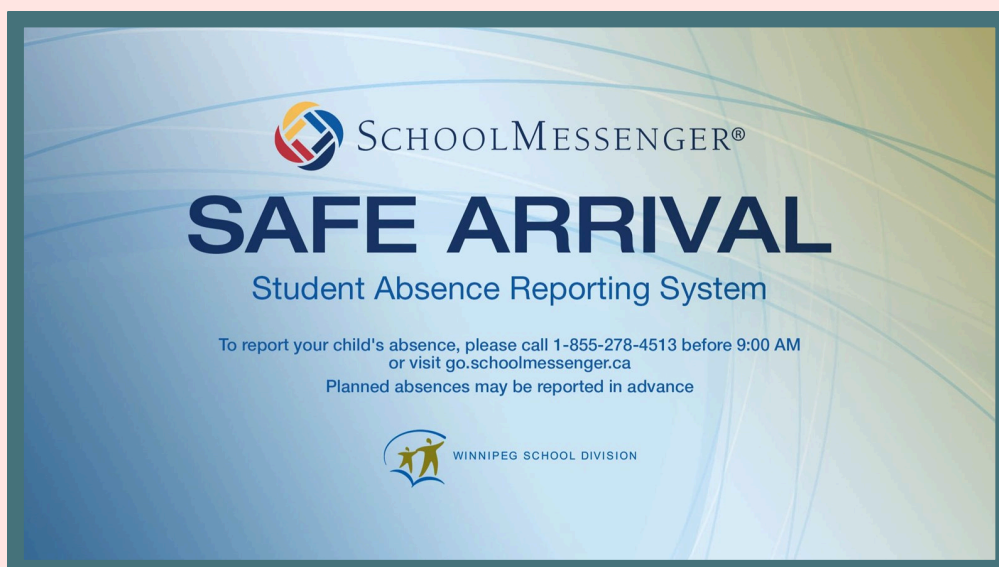
- **Keep your hands and feet to yourself at all times**

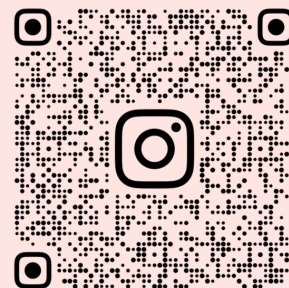
