VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

To ensure student safety...

- We ask that all caregivers and visitors report to the office using the **FRONT DOORS** of the school (please do not enter through student doors).
- Please use the BUZZ in entry and report directly to the office.
- If you wish to speak to a teacher, please make arrangements in the office. Teachers are expected to be supervising and engaging with students and are not always immediately available.
- Students arriving **LATE** should enter through the front doors to sign in at the office. Please do not accompany your child to class. Staff may be called to support if necessary.
- Please do not enter the field during recess times, community members will be asked to use the outside perimeter to access the front of the school.
- Caregivers accessing the **PARENT ROOM** are to sign in at the office and head directly to **ROOM 124**.

COMMUNICATING WITH TEACHERS

- Many of our teachers use SEESAW or GOOGLE CLASSROOM to connect with caregivers and provide a window into the classroom on a regular basis.
- Some platforms have direct messaging - please recognize that our staff are engaged with learners and are unable to continuously monitor your messages.
- Any **URGENT** or **TIME SENSITIVE** communication should be communicated to the office either by phone or in person.
- Teachers or admin will do their best to respond to your communication within 1 school day.
- Teachers and administration are not expected to respond to communication in the evenings or on the weekends.



ATTENDANCE

- School attendance is extremely important in a student's success at school. Absences impact learning as well as healthy relationships with peers.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.
- Chronic absences will result with **INCOMPLETE (IN)** scores on report cards, as teachers are unable to accurately assess learning growth.

WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT

- When a student is absent for 3 or more days without communication from caregivers - the school will reach out with a phone call or a home visit.
- If absences continue school staff may visit the home to connect and a letter from the school will be delivered and placed in PUPIL files. Caregivers will be asked to meet to create a plan for improved attendance.
- Chronic absenteeism will result in the school contacting outside agencies
