Donations can be brought to the office or your child's classroom between November 29 and December 9. All donated items will be stored and arranged in the kitchen.


Volunteers will be needed to help make this event a success.

Smudging involves the burning of traditional medicines, such sweet grass, cedar, and sage. This practice is based on traditional Indigenous beliefs that the smoke produced is means of purification and that it creates a positive mindset for those involved in the activity. The smudge will be held in the library and will be led by Mme Olsson. Those interested in joining us, the smudge will be held daily, and promptly, at 8:20am. This time my be adjusted in the future if we feel that we need longer for our smudge. Please use the front doors to enter the building.
