### Principal's Message

September has been a busy month. We started off the school year with our Meet the Staff BBQ, which was a huge success and we followed that up with our Welcome to Kindergarten evening. It was wonderful having families and students in the building during these times, and we felt as though these events set the tone for what is to come.

This year we are bringing back school assemblies! We had our first assembly September 8th, where we reviewed school and recess expectations. The assembly was run in French, with M. Carter acting out what was being said to much laughter. We followed this up with our second assembly September 15th, which was our first Family Groupings gathering. On this day we gathered to celebrate International Dot Day, a global celebration of creativity, courage, and collaboration. I had the privilege of reading Peter H. Reynold's *The Dot* to the whole school, and then students went with their family groups to spend time getting to know one another and then each student made their own dot in their family groupings colour. These dots were collected and used to create a beautiful mural down our hall.

September 22nd, the whole school participated in the Terry Fox run, with staff, students, and families walking through the community. The event ended with a bang—pies in the face for M. Carter, Mme Olson, M. Boateng, M. Olivier, and Mme Capina! On September 29th, we had to pivot for our first field day of the school year, but we were still able to engage in activities embedded in Indigenous teachings. Students and staff wore orange shirts and ribbons to commemorate and honor Truth and Reconciliation and to proclaim that Every Child Matters.

I want to give a huge thank you to all staff who participated in the planning and execution of these various events, as well as to the volunteers who helped make these possible.

Please help keep our students safe by following all traffic and parking signs around our school. We ask that students who are arriving at school by bicycle, skateboard, or scooter dismount prior to crossing the street with our Patrols, and to walk on school property. Our STOP, DROP & GO zones are in place, and we appreciate families abiding by them, as it helps with school bus accessibility and overall safety.

It was great to see so many of our families in September at our LaV Parent Council AGM Meeting, where a new executive group was elected. Parent Council meets once a month—virtually and in-person—and all are welcome to attend.

Finally, thank you, the community for a wonderful start to the year. I am honoured and proud to be part of the LaV family and am looking forward to the year ahead.
