Champlain School is a nursery to Grade 6 elementary school nestled in Winnipeg's North End.

We are home to approximately 230 students, 40 staff (teachers, educational assistants, clerks, custodians, and clinicians), and parent/community volunteers.

We have eight grades 1-6 and three Nursery/Kindergarten classrooms.

We are also home to Champlain Community Child care Centre.

The start of the school year has been a busy month of getting back to the learning groove, battling the cold weather, and singing our school song! Wahkohtowin on Friday, January 16 brought us all together to listen, play and eat in cross-grade groups.. This day was enjoyed by all as we continue to build community in our school.

Our staff are working on building student understanding in additive reasoning with focused daily math learning activities. The MathUp Framework is helping our staff plan for student learning about mathematical problem solving. We will be hosting neighbouring schools on Wednesday, February 11 as we continue our learning together.

February is **I love to read month** which brings many exciting celebrations! At Champlain, we are also honouring learning about Black History, Love & Kindness, Metis & French culture, and Inclusion. We are welcoming guest readers and performers, highlighted special books in our school library, Stop Drop and Read, games throughout the month, and a Family read afternoon. We will also serve some festive snacks throughout the month.

Winter weather is still here and we remind all families to send their children with warm clothing. If students do not bring warm clothing, we will provide alternate options or the child will remain inside. Thanks for your support!

Alternate indoor recess activities like karaoke, colouring, pokeman, dance, Pokémon fusion club, and more have begun. Lunch clubs are also underway like chess, PowWow Fit, Arts and Crafts club, Auntie time, and Inner city soccer and basketball clubs. Thanks to all the staff that have volunteered their time to facilitate these opportunities for our students!

Our next Parent council meeting is **Thursday, February 5, 2026 at 10am**. We will be discussing WSD budget, Nutrition Program, fundraising, and more.

### Playground supervision

The playground supervision in the morning only begins at 8:50am. Students may arrive at 8:30am for breakfast.



Playground supervision over the lunch hour is limited to lunch program students. If your child does not stay for lunch at school, please do not send them to play on the playground as there is no supervision. Please do not send your children before 1:55 PM.

After school, we clear the playground and ask that all children to “check in” with home before staying to play. Our desire is for all students to be safe.



## WHY ARE PATROLS IMPORTANT?

- Help students get home safely
- Signal the cars to stop so students can cross the street safely
- Protect the students
- Are a visual signal to drivers that students are around
- Are role models who represent our school

## Students being street smart

Does your child know how to be **street smart**? It's something we talk about in our classrooms because the safety of our students is very important. It's also a good thing to talk about at home as a regular reminder for your child.

Being street smart means knowing how to keep safe from strangers when we're alone or with other kids. Walking to school, the bus, the playground or riding your bike in your neighborhood, being street smart helps you stay **safe**.

Our school takes it very seriously when a student reports a suspicious person. In most cases, a police report is made and, sometimes, police are able to quickly interview the "suspicious" person and determine that it was a misunderstanding. At other times, however, police are required to conduct a bigger investigation of a more serious threat. We will let you know if we make a report of a suspicious person to police on behalf of one of our students because we believe that an informed community is a safer community.


# What You Can Do to Fight the Flu



1. Cover your coughs and sneezes.




2. Wash your hands a lot.


