First, I'd like to thank all the families for attending Parent-Teacher Night and for your continued support in your child's educational journey.

November has been a month of discovery and learning.

We focused on recognizing and forming the letters D, G, M, and L and practiced our letter sounds using visuals, gestures, chants, and games. Highlights included tossing "donuts" while chanting letter sounds, hunting for letters around the room, and writing our letters in "mud."

In math, we explored measurement using non-standard units, all while expanding our math vocabulary. We also practiced 1:1 counting through engaging games, worked on representing numbers with tally marks, and even honed our subitizing skills (recognizing dot patterns)—a fun way to reinforce routines and math concepts at the same time!

December may be a short month, but I'm confident it will be full of new discoveries, exciting learning opportunities, and continued growth.

Room 7 Gr. 1

This month, Room 7 is discovering the power of perseverance and growth through goal setting, inspired by the story The Magical Yet by Angela DiTerlizzi. This inspiring book teaches that even when things feel challenging, there's always a "Yet" to help us improve and succeed. Students are setting personal learning goals, such as home reading, applying their reading and writing strategies, and exploring new math problems. We're focusing on taking small steps, embracing mistakes, and celebrating progress. They're also bringing their creativity to life by designing their own "Yet" puppets and building unique "home" structures for their puppets to live in.













Room 9 Gr. 2/3

Hello all!

In ELA, students have been practicing using Razkids to read and listen to stories. We have a great opportunity November through December to work with Sarah Luhowy, our Indigenous Learning Support Teacher! She's working with all the classrooms to incorporate play into our learning routines. So we are working together in room 9 to help students retell stories through building and creating the important elements of stories. We've even been discussing "Would you rather..." questions and learning how to persuade others by giving strong reasons for our opinions. In Math, students have been exploring numbers through ten pairs using number lines, part-whole boxes, and cuisenaire rods. They're learning to represent numbers in different ways and are just beginning to understand the concept of place value with groups of ten. In Social Studies, we've reflected on the importance of Remembrance Day and started learning about natural resources. Keep an eye out for a queue card in your child's backpack! I've asked the students to interview their families and ask a few questions about natural resources in our province. Please help us in our next steps of learning by having a chat with them about it. We would love to get lots of responses to chart our data! In Art, we've been discovering the elements of shape, space, and texture, experimenting with how these elements make art come to life. It's been a wonderful few weeks of learning and growth!.

Room 4 Gr. 3/4

It's been a busy and exciting time in our Grade 3/4 classroom! Here are some of the wonderful things we've been learning and creating this month:

In Math, we've been exploring increasing and repeating patterns. The class had a great time using manipulatives like Cuisenaire rods, blocks, and shape blocks to create and extend different patterns. It's been a hands-on and engaging way to reinforce our understanding of how patterns work! In Science, students dived into a research project on geese migration. They investigated how and why geese migrate and presented their findings in creative Zine books. It was a fun way to showcase their knowledge and share their discoveries with the class. Our artists in the classroom experimented with Pointillism techniques in Art. Using tiny dots of color, students created beautiful, textured artworks. It was a great way to explore both patience and creativity, as they saw their pictures come to life one dot at a time! In Health, we learned about "sources of strength." Students discussed what helps them feel strong and supported in tough situations, whether it's family, friends, or personal strengths. It was a meaningful discussion about the things that help us stay resilient. In French, we've been learning how to introduce ourselves with basic vocabulary. Students practiced saying their names, ages, and interests in French. They've made great progress and are excited to continue growing their language skills! In Social Studies this month, our Grade 3/4 students have been exploring the provinces, territories, and capitals of Canada. They have been busy learning about the geographical regions that make up our country, and they've shown great enthusiasm for discovering more about Canada's diverse landscape.

Students worked on drawing and labeling maps of Canada, which helped them become more familiar with the locations of each province and territory, as well as their capitals. It was a wonderful opportunity to develop both their map-reading skills and their knowledge of Canadian geography.

In Reading, we've been enjoying the book The Wild Robot Escapes. Students are actively responding to the story by sharing their thoughts and ideas. To make it even more exciting, they've been building and presenting their ideas from the novel using LEGO creations! It's been a fantastic way to deepen their understanding while incorporating creativity into their responses.

It's been a wonderful month full of learning, creativity, and fun!









Room 3 Gr. 4/5

Hello I am Harmony and this is my friend Jane. Welcome parents and guardians! We will be telling you what we have been learning throughout this past month.

First, decimals. We have been learning about tenths, hundredths, and thousandths. For math, we have our math routine which is when our teacher gives us math questions on the board\tv, and we answer it in our math journal. That is what we do every morning.

In Language Arts, we are making a, drum roll please, a dodecahedron! It features 12 sides and it's about our home reading novel. 

Rm 9 has been writing their own rhythms inside of Ghosts.


Rm 3 has been working on their Xylophone skills by Learning the welcoming song Funga Alafia.



- 9 Instant Oatmeal





At Winnipeg School Division, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring all students arrive safely at school each and every day. To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, we are in the process of introducing to all of our schools a new, more efficient student absence reporting system called SafeArrival. This new system reduces the time it takes to verify student attendance, makes it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences. (see the regularly updated list below of schools using Safe Arrival). Please note, if you as a parent or guardian have questions about Safe Arrival or School Messenger, please contact your child's school directly.

With SafeArrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these three methods:

- 1. Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 2. Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to report an absence using the automated phone system. These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.
