Dear Families,

Another month has flown by, and our classroom has been filled with exciting learning experiences! Thank you for your continued support and involvement in our students' growth. This month, we began exploring what makes each of us unique, a theme that will continue throughout the year. Stay tuned for more updates on this journey of self-discovery!

In our colour study, we identified and described colours through videos, songs, poems, and sensory activities. We used tools like voice buttons, visuals, flashlight cards, scented markers, crayons, sand, floam, and playdough to enhance our learning through touch, sight, and smell.

Our letter learning journey began with the letters C, O, A, and D. The students practiced using sensory tools, catchy songs, fun chants, and engaging videos to help them recognize and write these letters.

We also continued our daily focus on rhyming, identifying initial sounds, and blending/segmenting compound words—essential skills for building strong readers!

In math, we explored the shapes around us and used our understanding of them to create and complete patterns. We wrapped up the month with a spooky fun Halloween-themed activity day, bringing October to a festive close!

There's so much happening in our classroom every day. Stay tuned for more exciting learning adventures!

Room 7 Gr. 1

Room 7 has been celebrating the story Where the Wild Things Are. The Wild Things kept us busy; we read the story, watched the play on our field trip, created our own Wild Things and wrote our first class book about them. In November, we will continue working on our writing, reading and math goals. We are continuing to observe the changes in seasons by observing, drawing, patterning and estimating with sunflowers, pumpkins and leaves. In honour of Remembrance Day, we will also be talking about peace and what that looks like in our classroom and school community.













Room 9 Gr. 2/3

I would like to extend a big congratulations to all the students working on their home reading each night. This class has a strong love of reading which is amazing to see and will take them so far! Please support your child in remembering to bring their book bag to school every day!

This month we kicked off our science learning by investigating the characteristics of solids and liquids. Students engaged in discussions, demonstrations, and experiments to observe how solids hold their shape while liquids take the shape of their containers. They discovered that solids in a container always have cracks and gaps between their parts and liquids do not. In social studies, we turned our attention to the characteristics of communities, learning how people, places, and resources work together to create a thriving environment.

To enhance our writing skills, we focused on non-fiction texts, practicing how to incorporate various text features like titles, captions, and diagrams to make our information clearer and more engaging.

In math, we introduced the concept of equality, and students had a great time using Cuisenaire rods to balance scales, visually demonstrating how different combinations can equal the same amount.

Finally, we emphasized the reading strategy of asking questions, encouraging students to think critically about the texts we explore, prompting discussions that deepen their understanding. See you again next month!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

My name is Mariefe Castillo, and I am absolutely thrilled to be your child's teacher this year. I am happy and grateful to be part of the Clifton community. With passion for teaching and a commitment to your child's success, I am here to guide, support and inspire them every step of the way.

In Math, students have been learning about measurements, place value and mental math strategies. We have been using math tools such as Cuisenaire rods, measuring tapes, ten frames, number lines, dice and ten blocks. In Science, we have been learning about migration. Students brainstormed wonderings they had and presented their ideas in graphic organizers like webs and charts. In Language Arts, we have been reading a chapter book called, "The Wild Robot". We have been practicing and developing our skills in making connections, asking questions, identifying key ideas and writing summaries. We have also been working on a diorama which allows the students to get a deeper understanding of the elements of the story. In Social Study, we have just started learning about Provinces and Capitals and we are all excited to explore, discover and describe cool stuff and interesting facts about them. We are planning to make a project called, "Community Rings". With this project, we are looking forward to creating a sense of belonging and developing their skills in inquiry, research and communication skills.

Dear Parents.


We kindly remind you to send lunch with your child each morning before school. This helps ensure they are prepared for the day and reduces interruptions to the school schedule.

At Winnipeg School Division, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring all students arrive safely at school each and every day. To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, we are in the process of introducing to all of our schools a new, more efficient student absence reporting system called SafeArrival. This new system reduces the time it takes to verify student attendance, makes it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences. (see the regularly updated list below of schools using Safe Arrival). Please note, if you as a parent or guardian have questions about Safe Arrival or School Messenger, please contact your child's school directly.

With SafeArrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these three methods:

- 1. Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 2. Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to report an absence using the automated phone system. These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.
