Welcome back to the 2024/2025 school year! It has been so wonderful to have students back in school, filled with energy and excitement for learning. We've had a great start to the year, and everyone is already making new friendships and adjusting well to the classroom routines and expectations.

Building Friendships & Classroom Choices

In Room 10, we've been focusing on the importance of making right choices and how they shape our day. We've explored how friendships, much like flowers, need care to grow. Together, we brainstormed ways we can be good friends to those around us. The students have shown a growing understanding of the value of kindness and the impact of their choices on themselves and others. Literacy Development

This month, we've been working on building essential literacy skills. Our focus has been on:

- Recognizing and creating rhyming words
- Hearing and producing initial sounds
- Blending two words together to form compound words
 These activities have been both engaging and challenging, allowing
 the students to build a strong foundation in early literacy.
 Math & Science Inquiry: Colours, Shapes, and Patterns
 Starting this month, we'll be diving into our Math and Science inquiry
 with a focus on colors, shapes, and patterns. These investigations will
 help students develop their problem-solving skills and foster
 curiosity as we explore the world of shapes and patterns all around
 us.

National Day of Truth and Reconciliation

In preparation for the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, Room 10 has spent time learning about the importance of this day and the significance of Orange Shirt Day. We've discussed the purpose of a sharing circle, exploring how it teaches respect and the power of listening. The students also crafted their own talking sticks, an Indigenous tool that symbolizes the right to speak and the responsibility to listen.

We've explored stories about the connection between people and nature through the lens of the medicine wheel. Additionally, our class worked together to create a collaborative piece to honour those impacted by Residential Schools and remember the many children who never returned.

Thank you for your continued support, and once again, welcome back! We look forward to a fantastic year ahead filled with learning, growth, and exploration.

At the tail end of the month the students have also started engaging in literacy centers, where they have a chance to work in small groups with myself, at independent stations, and with Mrs. Reis, our literacy support teacher.



Music/Arts



At Winnipeg School Division, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring all students arrive safely at school each and every day. To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, we are in the process of introducing to all of our schools a new, more efficient student absence reporting system called SafeArrival. This new system reduces the time it takes to verify student attendance, makes it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences. (see the regularly updated list below of schools using Safe Arrival). Please note, if you as a parent or guardian have questions about Safe Arrival or School Messenger, please contact your child's school directly.

With SafeArrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these three methods:

- 1. Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 2. Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to report an absence using the automated phone system. These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.
