During the summer break it is important for students to engage in safe and fun outdoor and indoor activities. Since many students will have more free time in the summer they will also likely be using devices on a more regular basis; participating in online group chats, playing online games, browsing the internet etc. To ensure their safety while using these devices it is important that
parents/guardians understand the online risks and trends that are currently occurring, monitor use of devices, and set limits to help safeguard children and youth online.
The website <u>ProtectKidsOnline.ca</u> is a resource developed by the Canadian Centre for Child Protection. It provides current information about online trends as well as strategies to reduce the potential risk of victimization or abuse of children and youth. It also provides guidance on how to
report instances of victimization or abuse.

So far, our class has completed over 20 000 practice questions! Students also used tools from our geometry sets to learn about geometry and angles. The whole school participated in our first Math Olympics. What a great day. In science we concluded our unit on water, learning about how Winnipeg gets it water then designed and built water filters. We had a wonderful field trip to Oak Hammock Marsh as well learning about weather, water, and the animals that live in and around our wetlands. We also learned about birds and flight that lead us into June. In June we will continue to study the principles of flight and had a field trip to the Royal Aviation Museum. There are plans for students from our class to help measure and build the tree bench that will be built around our school tree in the front and back of the building.
