



We practiced reading with expression. innotation, and emotion! It also helped us step out of our comfort zone to perform in front of our classmates!










Room 16 News

We learned about black history in Canada with our support teacher Ms. Rebecca. We used a timeline to understand the progress society was making towards human rights and equality.










We made "Did you know?" facts for the morning announcements then turned it into a green screen project!







Did you know . .


Beading with Mr. Jason

In February, Room 22 and 23 learned more about Canada's Black History. They learned about slavery in Canada and how the Underground Railroad helped many slaves escape to safety.






Kindergarten Room 6
