In accordance with the Terms of Reference for the Committee, the Inclusive Education Committee will provide an opportunity for any parents/guardians of a student with inclusive needs to provide feedback to the Board of Trustees on programs and services as well as networking with other parents with similar advocacy needs. The Committee will also be provided information on supports and programs offered by the Division and the community.

The first meeting will be held at Tec Voc High School on April 12, 2023, from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. An agenda will be distributed approximately one week prior to the meeting. The weather has forced us on many days to turn our Daily Mile community walk into an indoor activity. We have continued to explore many interesting healthy self-regulating exercises that we did in place of the outdoor walk.

We have started to explore the theme of "Water" this month. We will be learning about the importance and necessity of water in allowing life of all kinds to exist on our planet. We will be learning about issues pertaining to the sustainability of water on a local and global scale and talking about what we can do to make sure we preserve it for future generations. Students will be refining research skills and further developing their experiences with informational writing as we work through the theme. We have also been reviewing the continents/oceans/lines of latitude of the world and the provinces of Canada, completing individual maps as part of the process. Students learned about bilateral symmetry by completing "Name Monster" creatures that involved using handwriting, artistic, and writing process skills. Students have also been starting to prepare their portfolios that will be presented to parent/guardians at the upcoming student-led conferences.


The mathematicians and scientists have been busy this past month. We have been exploring multiplication and division concretely, pictorially and symbolically. We have even had a multiplication tournament! Practicing basic facts at
 home regularly will be very helpful.

Our University of Winnipeg student teacher, Ms. Fuller has been teaching students using a sharing circle, and done some gardening as well. Students have presented in small groups a presentation on weather.

Our next large theme will be 'Water'. This topic will involve science as well as ELA. Our latest T.U.S.C. meeting had a theme of water. Some very creative presentations
