

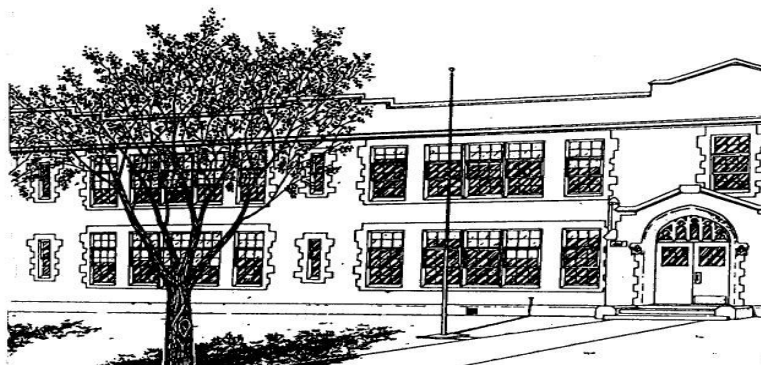

We are off to a fantastic start this school year! Our students are settling in nicely back to the routines of learning, and our staff are thrilled to have everyone back and engaged in learning. Everyone has worked very hard to ensure we have a successful start to this school year.

We also received an award from the Manitoba Historical Society, acknowledging our school's many contributions and successes over the last 100 years! We are so honoured to have been acknowledged, and delighted to have been given three more trees for our playground. It was nice to have our Mayor visit our school. He was very impressed with the learning that happens at Faraday and how polite our students are!

September 30th was the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. This day is recognized to honour survivors, their families and communities and ensure that the public commemoration of the history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of the reconciliation process. Also known as orange shirt day, it is a day to honour all of those who have survived residential schools, and to commemorate all of those who have not. We are continuing to work as a school community in our journey with reconciliation. "Remember the Children" is this year's theme. On September 29th at school everyone wore orange. We had an assembly lead by students where we honoured the idea that every child matters.

With Halloween around the corner, your child's teacher will be in touch to share with you what fun activities they have planned for your child this day. Reminder to please not dress your child in a scary costume, or one that has a mask or weapons. All treats brought into school should be store bought and be peanut free, thank you.

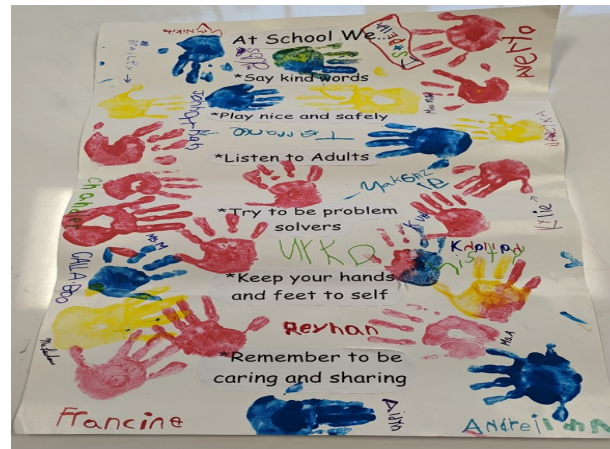
We have been enjoying getting to know and working with all the children in the Nursery/Kindergarten afternoon class.

Hello everyone and welcome to the 2022-2023 school year!

We spent the month of September establishing routines and getting to know each other, here in Room 8.

We finished our very first writing project of the year. We brain stormed for ideas about what our community needs, and then wrote a persuasive paragraph on why we feel we need our idea in our community. Some examples we thought and wrote about were: a pet daycare, free apartments for the homeless, and an indoor playground. We spoke about the writing process a lot too.

In numeracy we began looking at odd and even numbers, base ten blocks and simple addition and subtraction. One of our favourite parts of our class time is Morning Bin time, where we get to choose an activity from the shelf and work with a friend or two. Each bin focuses on a Literacy or Numeracy activity.

We completed an art activity where we learned a new technique using chalk pastels. We layered colours and then used our fingers to blend the colours together. We made beautiful sunflowers!

Looking at October we will begin our Reading Groups as well as Home Reading, so stay tuned for that! We will continue working on understanding numbers to 100, specifically looking at how we can represent those numbers. We will complete a narrative writing piece as well.

Don't forget to connect to our Seesaw Journals to see all of our learning at play and to stay connected!

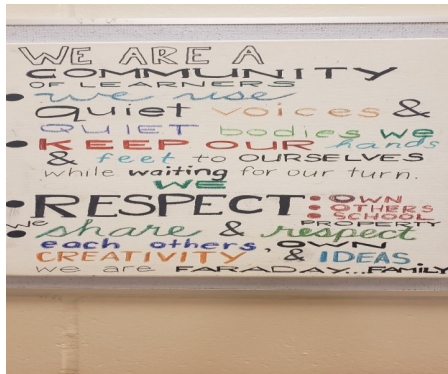

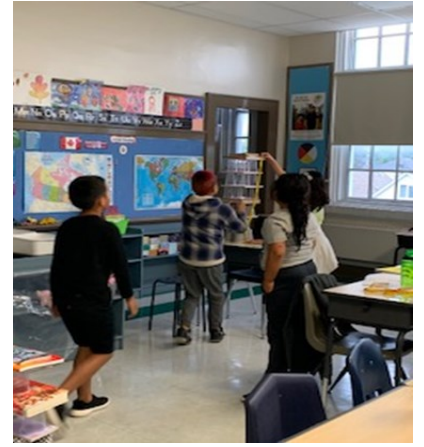

September has flown by with a whirl of activity in our classroom. Our group activities in Science and Math stimulate vibrant conversation and problem-solving skills for all levels of understanding. We are becoming critical thinkers in our literacy studies while investigating and discussing credibility of sources for research. These strategies also help us to recognize the power of word choice and historical accuracy in our indigenous studies. Stay tuned to November as the students of Room 14 take over the task of our classroom newsletter submissions to relate their understanding of our newly learned skills.



Well, the first month of the school year has flown by! Much of September was spent establishing classroom rules and routines and developing our classroom community. One of the big changes this school year is that the students move back and forth between Rm 23 (Mr. Antymis), where they learn about Math and Science, and Rm 18 (Mr. Waytowich) where Language Arts and Social Studies are taught. Students generally switch classes once in the morning and once in the afternoon. Just a reminder that students in Rm 18 are expected to bring their own individual supplies to school. If you are still in need of a supply list, please contact the school and we will make sure one is sent home with your child. We also began the assessment of students in Language Arts and Math to get a sense of where individuals are at, to help plan activities that will assist with further growth and progress in these areas. We are off to a very good start and have 29 students with positive attitudes who are eager to learn and try out new activities!

We spent a great deal of time this past month, discussing a variety of current events including the passing of Queen Elizabeth II, the municipal election, and issues pertaining to Truth and Reconciliation Day. We also spent time talking about the events of 9/11 and learned about Philippe Petit, the man who inspired many by walking on a cable between the Twin Towers when they were being built in the 1970's. Students watched several videos about this amazing man and were asked to write a letter to him as a follow up assignment. As part of our yearly Terry Fox Run, we also spent time learning about this Canadian legend. After learning about the personal history of Terry Fox, students were asked to complete an assignment that reflected upon what was learned about this national hero.

Welcome back to all students. I am excited to be part of a new co-teaching program with Mr. Waytowich where I teach Math and Science and he will teach the English Language Arts and Social Studies. Both students and teachers are working with class transitions and the sharing of school supplies. Patience is a virtue. Students have been given a schedule of room 23 classes.

So far, we have begun participating in small groups in math where we are working on patterns. There will be a weekly math problem of the week that is given at the beginning of the week and due at the end. This will be the routine for the year. Our first unit in Science is on weather. 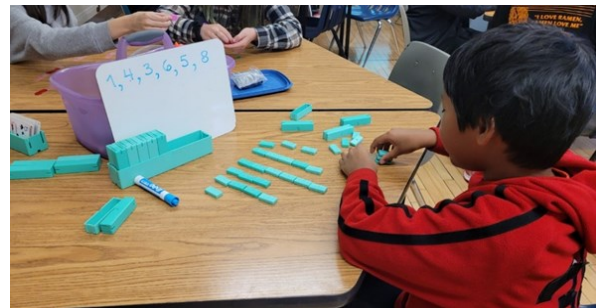

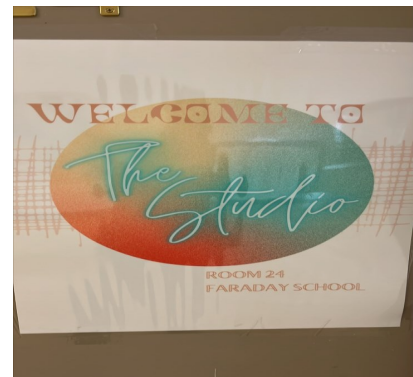
