SCHOOL TRAFFIC & STUDENT SAFETY

Drop-Off and Pick-Up Guidelines

Please adhere to all traffic rules within school zones. Student safety is our highest priority and we ask that all drop-offs and pick-ups be done at the side of the school on Burnell Street, adjacent to the field. There has been an increase in traffic violations and we ask that we all do our part to ensure the safety of all community members. See below for safety procedures:

Double Parking is Not Permitted

 This has been identified as the most dangerous practice around the school. It limits visibility, traffic flow, and boxes-in drivers and school buses. Double parking is illegal at all times and subject to enforcement action.

Parking in Staff Parking Lot

 The staff parking lot is for staff only, and not to be used as a pick-up or drop-off zone for students.



COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Mandi Jacobson, our new Community Support Worker (CSW), will be at General Wolfe School on Tuesdays, Thursdays and alternating Fridays. The responsibilities of a CSW may include but are not limited to:

- support/advocacy to students and families
- home visits to strengthen school and community connection
- support with attendance, family concerns and other barriers to school attendance
- Community Conversation & Coffee (formerly Parent Advisory Council) monthly meetings
- volunteer recruitment
- organizing community events (e.g., feasts, BBQ)
- networking with other agencies to provide additional supports and referrals to families

- 1. In accordance with the new Manitoba Education and divisional policies, mobile devices are banned during school hours, inclusive of breaks and lunch hours.
- 2. Mobile devices must be switched OFF and stored in backpack or locker AT ALL TIMES.
- 3. Mobile devices are not to be on students' person (e.g., in pockets of hoodie or jeans)
- 4. Refusal to follow rules may result in the following:
- a private warning
- teacher confiscation and note/phone call home
- office confiscation and parent/guardian picks up the mobile device



GINGERBREAD HOUSE MAKE & TAKE


On Tuesday, December 17th from 5:30 – 6:30, we will be hosting a Gingerbread House Make & Take (for caregivers only). A light dinner will be available.
