Gladstone School is a Nursery to Grade 6 elementary school with a diverse and dynamic population of approximately 250 students. At last count, 33 different languages are spoken by our families. Our catchment draws from Osborne Village, Downtown Winnipeg as well as the surrounding areas. We are a small school with a big heart!

We work very hard to provide an inclusive environment for all our learners. We believe in a strength-based approach and building strong relationships with students and families. Though we are small, we provide technology, physical education, arts education, as well as inclusive programming and literacy support for all our students. This year, we joined a pilot project which looked at strengthening our numeracy programming at the class and school levels. We have embraced the outdoors and nature as another teacher and are very excited about our Nature Based Learning proposed playground enhancements.

We believe strongly that our students are leaders and as such we offer multiple opportunities for students to become involved in leadership experiences, including patrols, student council, learning mentors, recess helpers, just to name a few.

Priorities 2024 - 2025

❖ Literacy

❖ Library Nights

Our families were welcomed into our library twice each month to enjoy some food, games, crafts and an opportunity to take out books.

❖ Family Volunteers

❖ Fort Rouge Co-op Day Nursery - School Age Program

This neighborhood daycare shares 1 of our classrooms for their school-age Before and After program. We work in close contact with the daycare staff to ensure that student's needs are met.

❖ Fort Rouge Child Care

This is another neighborhood daycare that we work closely with. Students attending this daycare are walked to and from school.

❖ River Osborne Community Centre

We share the field with the Community Centre and also use the centre as our safe evacuation site. It is a priority to look for ways to continue to partner with the Community Centre/City of Winnipeg.

❖ Partnership

We have partnered with the University of Manitoba and Red River Community College, Project 11, Ace Burpee from Hot 103, N.E.D.S. Centre, St. John's Ambulance, MPI, Swimming Counts as well as visiting many businesses in the neighborhood.
