Flex: Learning That's Meaningful and Fun



- Combines traditional subjects with project-based learning
- Encourages student to explore their interests and take ownership of their learning
- Includes familiar assessments like tests, quizzes, presentations, and interviews
- Builds curiosity, confidence, and collaboration

Inside the Flex Classroom

- Cross-curricular projects connecting subjects
- Opportunities to guide your own learning
- Learning is interactive and community-based

- Enjoy working on projects independently and/or in groups
- Want to have more voice and choice in your learning
- Like exploring ideas in creative ways
- Are curious and love asking big questions



Advanced: Dive Deeper. Think Harder. Go Further



- Faster paced designed for students ready for more academic challenges
- Accelerated courses include enriched content and some will include grade 9 topics
- Time-management and responsibility are emphasized

Inside the Advanced Classroom

- Students are self-motivated and self-directed
- Deep exploration of topics
- Preparing students for the rigor of the Advanced Placement program in high school













Advanced Might Be a Great Fit if You...

- Achieve high grades (Gr 6 = mostly 4's, Gr 7 high 80 and 90%)
- Work well independently and use class time wisely
- Are motivated and enjoy a challenge
- Are willing to spend time outside of school to go deeper.

What's the Right Fit for YOU?





Q1: How are students assessed in the Flex program?

A: Flex uses a variety of assessment methods, including tests, quizzes, presentations, interviews, and project work. Students are evaluated in line with curriculum outcomes.

Q2: Is Flex still a multi-grade program?

A: While Flex included multi-grade classes in the past, this is no longer a core feature of the program. Class groupings are now based on enrollment, and multi-grade combinations will only occur if necessary due to numbers.

Q3: Will Advanced students miss out on creativity or collaboration?

A: Not at all. Advanced students still participate in group work and creative assignments, but the focus is more on depth, pace, and academic challenge.

Q4: Does Flex prepare students for high school as well as Advanced?

A: Yes! Both programs build essential skills for high school — just in different ways. Flex develops communication, collaboration, and creativity. Advanced builds academic stamina and subject depth.

Q5: If I don't choose Advanced in Grade 8, can I change my mind in Grade 9?

A: Yes. Students can opt into Advanced programming in high school. Grade 8 is a great starting point, but it's not the only chance to access enriched learning.
