All grades have been participating in low organized and cooperative games this past month to support and enhance their fundamental movement skills. During this time, I was able to connect with and begin getting to know the students.

News from Stem & French by Mr. Mont

STEM

With the coding portion of the year drawing to a close it is time to take stock and reflect on all that the students have learned and how amazingly far they have come. The grade 1/2 classes have finished the first in a series of courses on Code.org and have become proficient at problem solving using block coding. One of the grade 2s has even far exceeded what the grade 5/6s have accomplished! It is truly amazing how fast these young minds learn in a virtual medium.

Grades 3/4/5/6 have parlayed their previous experience with block coding into a very successful and fun section using Microbits. These students were provided a series of goals for which to write code and without fail students repeatedly rose to the high expectations set and often jumped over that bar. The benefit of having a physical tool in their hands provided an authentic coding experience and offered an opportunity to imagine how coding skills might work in the wider world.

In all cases, students were extremely excited when coding class was on the schedule and many brought their work home and pushed further, on their own. If you are interested in talking about this with your children, the following websites supported our learning this year:

Français

There is much on the horizon for April, in the French Lab. Students will be adding a deeper understanding of the use of gender in French language and a body parts refresher to their knowledge of clothing, families, numbers and colours. These skills will culminate in a short art piece and a longer term, inter-student conversation unit in which generation of new language will be the focus. The goal of the third term will be for students to be able to speak to anyone whilst describing another person and their relationship to themselves, their wardrobe, and be able to pose a question or two to another person about their description. It is a high bar for sure, but I am confident that our students can rise to the challenge and really find success in language creation that will further drive their love of learning languages in general.

Il y a beaucoup à l'horizon pour avril, au laboratoire du français. Les élèves ajouteront une compréhension plus profonde de l'utilisation du genre en français et un rappel des parties du corps à leur connaissance des vêtements, des familles, des nombres et des couleurs. Ces compétences aboutiront à une courte œuvre d'art et à une unité de conversation inter-étudiants dans laquelle la génération du nouveau langage sera au centre des préoccupations. L'objectif du troisième trimestre sera que les étudiants puissent parler à n'importe qui en décrivant une autre personne et leurs relation à eux-mêmes, leurs garde-robe, et pouvoir poser une question ou deux à une autre personne sur leurs description. C'est certain que la barre est haute, mais je suis convaincu que nos étudiants peuvent relever le défi et vraiment réussir dans la création linguistique, ce qui stimulera d'avantage leurs amour de l'apprentissage des langues en général.
