Cold Weather Guidélines

On days when the wind chill hazard is -28°C or below (per Environment Canada, The Forks), all students will be staying inside for their activity breaks.

Buses will be cancelled when the wind chill is -45°C or colder. It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to check the WSD website (www.winnipegsd.ca) or listen to the radio for bus cancellations. Parents are also responsible to find alternate transportation for their child(ren). Please remember to enter the information into Safe Arrival if your child will be absent due to a bus cancellation.

Until the temperature with the wind chill reaches -26°C, patrols will be assigned to their regular posts. Once the temperature hits -27°C, patrol duties will be shortened to 5 minutes. No patrols will be on duty once the

temperature is -34°C or colder.
