Message from the Principal

September was a busy month. We started off the school year with our third annual Meet the Staff BBQ, which was a wonderful and relaxed event where we got to connect with familiar and new families. It was wonderful having families and students in the building during this time, and we feel as though this set the tone for what is to come.

We had our first assembly on September 6th, where we reviewed school and recess expectations. The 6th was the first day of school for our Nursery and Kindergarten students, and the entire school gave them a warm welcome at the assembly. We followed this up with our second assembly on September 11th, which was our first Family Groupings gathering. On this day we gathered together, and I had the privilege of reading Peter H. Reynold's *Ish* to the whole school. The story *Ish* encourages children to embrace imperfection as an asset, as well as to recognize that one person's negative opinion doesn't have to change the way they feel or act. After the story, students went with their family groups to spend time getting to know one another and then each student made their own *Ish* drawing of their family groupings sacred animal. These *Ish* drawings were collected and used to create a beautiful display in our main hall. September 20th, the whole school participated in the Terry Fox run, with staff, students, and families walking through the community. The event ended with a bang—pies in the face for teachers and EAs!

On September 27th, we participated in the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation. We met as a school in the gym, where we talked about Orange Shirt Day, read a powerful story, and then walked together through the community wearing our orange shirts and ribbons to commemorate and honor Truth and Reconciliation and to proclaim that Every Child Matters. I want to give a huge thank you to all staff who participated in the planning and execution of these various events, as well as to the volunteers who helped make these possible. Please help keep our students safe by following all traffic and parking signs around our school. We ask that students who are arriving at school by bicycle, skateboard, or scooter dismount prior to crossing the street with our Patrols, and to walk on school property. Our STOP, DROP &

GO zones are in place, and we appreciate families abiding by them, as it helps with school bus



- and subject related materials necessary for experiments and projects..




Student Registration Information

Student Absence Reporting System

What is Safe Arrival?

Safe Arrival is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for you to let the school know about your child's absence.

School Messenger / Safe Arrival App (Free)

- 1. Provide your email address to the school.
- 2. Get the app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store.
- 3. Tap Sign Up to create your account.
- 4. Select Attendance from the menu, and then select Report and Absence.

Web and Mobile Web option: go.schoolmessenger.com

- 1. Provide your email address to the school.
- 2. Go to the website.
- 3. Click Sign Up to create your account.
- 4. Select Attendance from the menu, then select Report and Absence.

The school does attendance twice a day - at 8:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.

If your child(ren) is/are marked absent from their class and and absence was not added onto the Safe Arrival system, you will receive an email and an automated call from the system.
