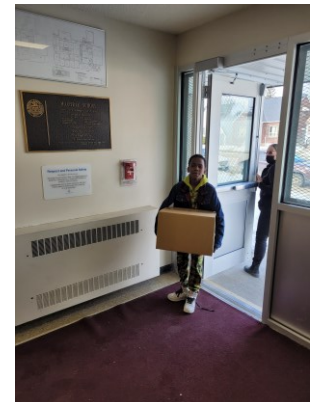

Numeracy

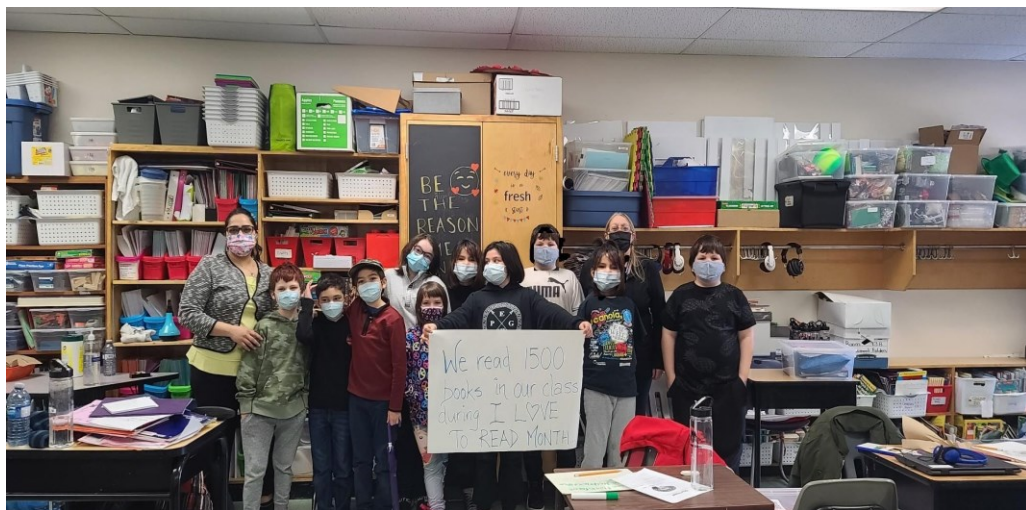
- School Math Wall to support student-centered demonstrations of learning.

Numeracy

To continue to develop best numeracy practice through:

- A focus on numeracy basics.
- Focus on developing Modelling and Communicating Strategies through Student/Public Conferencing, Turn and Talk and Various Representations.
- Focus on exploring effective math manipulatives and how to use them.
- Focus on big ideas and differentiated instruction to ensure entry points for all learners.
- To establish an expected math routine.
- Collection of Evidence of Student Growth Booklet (ESGB) data collection. To use this as a guide for instruction.

Education for Sustainable Development

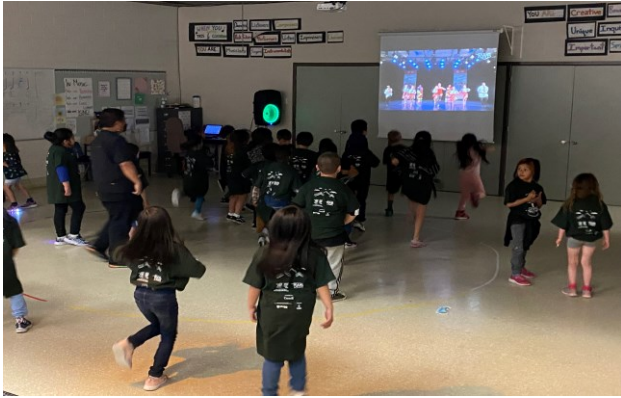
To expand on current Sustainable Development practice through:
