

THE HIGHLIGHTS

90% of Mulvey Students in regular classrooms increased their reading level by at least one grade or reached their grade level during 2024-2025.

STEAM Fair and Drone Camp featured literacy and problem solving activities using Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math activities under direction of WSD Lead Teachers.

Parent/Guardian participation rate at Parent/Guardian Teacher Student Conferences increased to 97.9%.

Talk To Me and Read to Me literacy interventions provided opportunities to increase reading and oral language skills.

The Second Step Program, Thrival Kits, and a school Pro-Social Program promotes the development of positive good citizenship and safe behaviours that are connected to the Seven Teachings.

Clinical Supports available in: Psychology, Reading, Social Work, Speech and Language provided by Clinical Support Services, and Occupational Therapist on referral.

Enrichment Programs in the arts, technology, science, outdoor education, film making, sports, drama, dance and music. Inter-School Mulvey Team sport play in Soccer, Flag Football, Running, Volleyball and Basketball

Art Programming featured use of art, literature, drama movement, music and technology to enhance the curriculum.

School Nutrition Programs include: Breakfast Program, Daily Snack for Nursery-Grade 6 students, Parent run lunch program, student and parent nutrition education programs.

Partnerships with: Misericordia Health Centre, WRHA and Shared Health, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Wpg, Balmoral Hall School, Westgate Mennonite Collegiate, All Saints, RB Russell High School, Art City, WBYO, Acorn Family Place, BNC West Broadway Community Org., Bear Clan Patrol, Wpg Humane Society, University of MB - Dentistry, Food Rescue Canada, Bridging The Gap, CanU, Winnipeg Blue Bombers, Football Manitoba, Valour FC, Anti-Racism in Sport, and Community members.

Mulvey School students engaged in community clean-up on the playground, boulevards and parks in the surrounding areas of the school.

Remembrance Day Commemoration, Winter Concert, Music Recital, and Touring choir performances were shared in the school community, seniors' residences, personal care homes.

The power of the music curriculum was brought to Mulvey with our marvelous music teacher. Music, literacy and storytelling was further brought to life during the Travel with Stories Event all promoting arts growth.

Mulvey Pow Wow Club and students participated at W.S.D. 6th Annual Pow Wow. Students, participation in WSD Choral Performance, Quantum, WAG and Young Artist Programs.

Enriched Science Programming with in person field trips to Fort Whyte Centre, Oak Hammock Marsh, Assiniboine Park, Camp Cedarwood, The Leaf, and Manitoba Museum.

State of the art technology available to support student learning through a computer lab, Interactive SMART Board, Apple TV and an ipad in every class, as well as 90 laptops, 70 ipads, and 150 Chrome Books divided in 10 mobile pods.

Read to Me results show that 86% of all grades 1-3 students have raised their reading level by at least one grade or reached their grade level in reading. Support Staff, Talk to Me, Nursery Program, Welcome to Kindergarten Bags Phonological Awareness, Tier Two Intervention, EAL and literacy programming, are additional resources providing early intervention.

Weekly school wide assemblies featured student generated presentations promoting community, learning and targeted pro-social topics, as well as Second Step Programming.

Students participated in sport mornings 4 times a week and Grades 1-6 students in cohort age sports once per week.

Art Education offered by a specialist, provided opportunities in pottery, painting, sculpture, print making, as well as participation in community visual arts displays. Participation in community visual arts displays

Numerous Sustainable Development initiatives promoted environmental health, such as: Idle Free Zones, energy conservation programs, plastic bag and battery recycling programs, school plans for styrofoam, plastic and paper reduction. Take Pride Winnipeg, Waste Reduction Wednesdays and the reusable cup and plate program was a tremendous success.

Pro-Social Program awarded 1 597 Acts of Recognition, 1 954 SAFE Tickets, and 963 Being my B.E.S.T. Cards.

Parent/child programming facilitated by a community support worker and NEEDS Inc., Welcome to Kindergarten N/K Home Learning Kits, Literacy & Parenting Programs, Virtual Nutrition, MYRCA Club, Young Writers Club, and Tim Horton's Camp. Circle of Security, EAL classes, Service Canada session and many parent room initiatives and events.

Annual community events: Remembrance Day, Winter Concert, Freeze Frame Film Festival, Career Week, Manitoba Theatre for Young People, Science Symposium, Grade 6 Farewell, mentors virtual visits, care cards to personal care homes, Penpal Program with Sao Jorge School and BBQ.

Healthy Living focused on promoting nutrition education, and mindfulness. Student Leadership Team addressed kindness, citizenship, environmental, social and economic issues.

Parent Council enjoyed another very successful year with many initiatives and activities that saw an increase in parental involvement, volunteerism and a significant positive impact on the school.
