

Grades 3 & 4 Mr. K. Storey

April has been a busy month, just like all our previous months.
Spring break stretched into the first week of April, so it felt like we were coming back to school later than usual. The students did a great job of remembering their math

lessons from before



spring break. We have continued on with our study of fractions, and now we have expanded into decimals and percentages. This is a difficult math concept for kids to work with, and I am proud of how well many of our students have picked up how fractions work.

In our second week back in April, our class headed to the Zoo for our spring field trip. We were accompanied by a Zoo Guide who showed the students all sorts of animal adaptations. We ended our morning with a classroom session where the students got to handle seal skin, a polar bear claw, and a polar bear skull replica. We got to see a lot of animals. Best of all, we got to see the polar bears playing in the tunnels. This was an excellent demonstration of the power of these magnificent animals.

With writing, we are working on our how-to stories. Students have picked a topic they are familiar with and have written a detailed step-by-step description of how to do that thing. Draft copies are mostly done, and in May these stories will be posted on our bulletin board.





Nursery & Kindergarten Mrs. N. Schneider



This month the students have been studying about diversity. We discussed the uniqueness of each other. The students made a beautiful mural to represent their understanding about the importance of respecting other

cultures and belongingness in the community. The students have been showing an interest in learning about butterflies. This discussion has now lead to what they know about butterflies, as well as what the students want to know and wonder about butterflies. The children have been very busy identifying and sequencing the lifecycle of a butterfly. In addition to all of their learning about butterflies, the students will also be creating watercolor butterflies while learning about symmetry. Our Nursery and Kindergarten journey continues as we continue learning about Spring. The students have been investigating the different signs of spring. The students will be estimating, counting, sorting, and patterning different varieties of seeds, as well as planting and measuring the growth of their own individual plants. To celebrate Earth Week, students made an art project based on the earth and a promise to the earth. The students brainstormed ways to make the earth a better place for people and other living things. The students created a beautiful mural showing how they can respect the earth, which will be displayed in the hallway. Our Nursery and Kindergarten journey continues. I enjoy watching the progress that each and every child has made this term. Thank you for your continued support!

Most of our conversations have connected nicely with Earth Day, which was on April 22. We tied the needs of animals to what our part is every day when it comes to taking care of our planet and the animals in it. For Earth Day, we created books about how we can take care of the Earth, and what each one of us can do to make a difference. We had so many things to write about in our Earth Day books. Early April, we were able to go on a field trip to The Children's Museum. The children had an amazing time exploring and playing. We ended our visit with a hands-on activity which allowed everyone to create a car out of recycled materials and then race it down a ramp. It was a very fun and educational experience for everyone! In the classroom, we continue to work on building our numeracy skills. We have been looking closely at place value, subtraction, even and odd numbers and using the symbols for more than, less than and equal to. We have been using hands on materials and games, Mathletics, Mathseeds, and pencil and paper activities to show our learning. We continue to review all our past math concepts and skills as well. Read to Me has been going very well, we are reading and writing so much in our classroom! I am so proud of all the students for working so hard on their reading and writing skills. Grades 2 & 3 Mr. K. Wiens

In Math, we continue to build our knowledge of how to break numbers into groups of hundreds, tens, and ones with a new math game as well as starting to look at how to tell time. Grades 4 & 5 Mr. S. Macdonell

Spring has finally arrived, and with it has come an exciting and busy month in our classroom! Here's a quick look at what we've been up to in April. In ELA, we have been exploring different ways to present information—both in writing and through projects. Students have also been working hard on their reading skills and continuing to grow as spellers. It's been great to see their confidence build in all areas of language!

This month in math, we wrapped up our Patterns and Algebra unit and dove into fractions. Students are learning how to identify, compare, and represent fractions in different ways—and so far, they're doing a fantastic job! In Social Studies, we've been busy researching important Manitobans, both from the past and present. Students showed what they learned by creating posters and slideshow presentations. In Science, we've been exploring sound—





how it's made, how it travels, and how we hear it.

In Language Arts, we will continue to hone our skills at becoming poets with the goal of creating their own poetry booklets. In Mathematics we are continuing to learn attributes of 2D and 3D shapes and are finding shapes in our environment. We enjoyed our field trip to the Children's Museum where we learned all about how wheels and axles work together. We also thoroughly enjoyed our field trip at the Assiniboine Zoo. What an exciting month of learning!

Spring has finally sprung! I hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather! During the month of April, we celebrated Earth Day and learned what we can do to help take care of our home. In one of our morning discovery centers, students were able to use their creativity to design art pieces using recycled objects. We even had a day at school where we kept our lights off and used only natural light coming from our beautiful windows to help reduce our use of electricity. We learned that we can all do small things to help take care of our Earth! Our field trip to the Children's Museum was so exciting! Students enjoyed exploring the museum and furthering their learning of trees. It was such a unique experience to learn in a new environment using play and exploration. Speaking of trees, we have been talking about what we see, smell, hear and feel that tells us that spring is here and the season is changing. Later on in the month, we will be doing some planting in our classroom! Students will be estimating, sorting, and counting a variety of seeds, as well as planting and measuring the growth of their own plants. We are also using centers to solidify our past learning. We also continue to review different types of patterns and practice our daily counting skills during calendar time.

Our Show and Tell is off to a fabulous start! Please remember to mark down the date of your child's Show and Tell to be sure we do not miss anyone's special day! While we are on the topic of special days, we will be going on another full day field trip to the Morning Sound Farm on Thursday, May 29th. Stay tuned for a detailed note with more information closer to the date. It is hard to believe there are only two months left of this school year. As the weather turns warmer, enjoy spending time outdoors with your family and consider moving your daily reading time outdoors! We look forward to learning, exploring and having a lot of fun as our kindergarten journey continues for the remainder of our 2025 school

What a lovely start to spring everyone. I am pleased at how everyone has jumped into their projects with enthusiasm. The grade 1/2 students are starting to look at cultural dances from around the world and selecting which type of dance they would like to learn. The intention is to share our dances with the elderly at Misericordia place in June. The grade 2/3's have finished their English word art and are moving on the using the same shape/word but in a different language. It has been interesting for me to watch you translate these words and this word art process as you re-do the same thing with a twist. I can really see your growth and learning. Room 21 have all finished their habitat contour drawings and students are now working on adding their food chain animals/plants into their art. Room 17 has been working towards making coil patterned clay bowls. Most recently they have been learning how to properly attach pieces of clay together so their bowls will not break in the kiln. I hope you all stay diligent as this part is super important to do right. The grade 4/5's have begun the first few art pieces in their still life perspective series. As they finish each version of the same subject they will get stickers on their punch cards till they have done them all. So far the focus and resulting art has been phenomenal from all of you.

All the grade 5/6's are trying their hand at glass art. Showcased today in this months Artist Alley are the students from room 13 who are finally finishing their stained glass mosaics. They took a long time but the resulting artwork looks spectacular! Meanwhile rooms 16 and 18 have made progress learning how to use the glass cutting tools to safely start their glass layers on their planets/celestial bodies.


