COLD WEATHER AND SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS

With December upon us, we would like to send a reminder to families to please make sure your child/ren are dressed appropriately to walk to and from school and for outdoor recesses. We will have indoor recess when the wind chill is at – 28C or below. Between –28C and –34C, patrols will do a shortened duty. At –35C patrols will not go on duty. Also, in the event schools need to be closed due to severe weather conditions, announcements are made on all local radio and tv stations. The Division's website (www.winnipegsd.ca) will also carry this message. We will be using "Environment Canada - Forks" as our source of weather information. We would also like to once again remind families of the parking restrictions surrounding the schools especially during pick-up and drop-off times.





OUTSTANDING STUDENT FEES



Each day we will highlight one item on Harvest Manitoba's top ten most needed items list. Food is a basic necessity of life yet so many in our city go without on a daily basis. We encourage all to donate what you can. It is so important that we show love and caring to our neighbours.

Dec. 6th

Did you know that your family and friends can volunteer at Harvest Manitoba? There are jobs for people of all ages and abilities. You can volunteer for an hour, a day or on a regular basis.

On the first day of giving Riverview gave **canned fish and poultry**. Tuna, Salmon, Chicken or Turkey are always in demand.

Dec. 9th

Did you know that 1800 infants require emergency baby formula from Winnipeg Harvest each month.

On the second day of giving Riverview gave Baby Food and formula.

Dec. 10th

Did you know that 108 000 people receive help from Harvest Manitoba every month. If you think about that – that would be equivalent to filling the MTS Centre once with adults and once with children.

On the third day of giving Riverview gave Canned Fruit and Vegetables

Dec. 11th

Did you know that Harvest Manitoba has a 'Kids Who Care' program which recognizes youth in our community who have made an extraordinary effort to donate time, food and/or money to Winnipeg Harvest.

On the fourth day of giving Riverview gave Canned Beans, Chili or Stew

Dec. 12th

Did you know that at least half of the volunteers at Harvest Manitoba are people who need emergency food themselves and who work hard to give something back.

We look out of the window every day to do our weather report, and the whole class loved watching how the trees change from October to November. We read lots of books about how trees change from season to season and we were excited to learn that the leaves have an important job to do once they fall to the ground. The leaves provide warmth to animals and insects and provide the soil with valuable nutrients as they break down. We completed lots of beautiful fall inspired leaf art and completed lots of fall patterns in math.

We have had a very busy November in room 201. The students completed their studies of bats and learned many new interesting facts about what bats eat, where they live and how mother bats find their babies. In math, they have been playing a variety of addition and subtraction dice games and they learned about addition and subtraction fact families. In French, we have been continuing to sing, listen to and respond to stories, work on alphabet sounds and we have started to locate sounds within words. Finally, in English Language Arts, we have been learning new sounds using the UFLI program and reading short, decodable texts. Students have been enjoying creating silly sentences each week. We are looking forward to making seasonal crafts and participating in various activities next month!



Room 207 - Mme Arnold

We have been learning to build 2 digit numbers using base ten blocks and to write numbers in the expanded notation. Students have begun learning 2 digit addition. In French, students have begun literacy centers reinforcing the sounds they are learning in class. They have continued learning about bats. Students created bat habitats as well as art pieces using warm colours.


