




Room 105 - Mrs. Galbraith




Which do you like the best?


Room 209 - Mrs. Dorman

Math

In math, we completed learning about Time.

We are learning about Area and Perimeter. In math groups, we continued to practice subtraction on a number line, understanding its whole-part relationship and multiplication using the area model by decomposing the numbers.





In science, we continued learning about the properties of light – Refraction and Absorption through videos and experiments led by each co-pilot group.





Health

We continued discussing how to navigate situations to identify the size of the problem, and how our reaction should match the size of that problem. We are also learning about Seven Safety Strategies and working on a dental hygiene project.

Literacy

This month the students wrote and illustrated a book for their classmate, called The Noah Book. Using the writing process they

brainstormed, rough drafted and then typed their final copies. Each author created a water colour illustration to accompany their writing.

Ancient Egypt studies continue, most recently focusing on transportation, housing, foods and daily life.

WAG Field Trip

This month, we joined two other Riverview classrooms for a tour and art lesson at the Winnipeg Art Gallery. This was a first-time experience for many and highlighted how



art can be used to express emotions and share stories. It also got them excited about sharing their works through the June 5th Art Show at Riverview!!






Room 301 - M Maciejewski


Song Revue May 28, 2025

The average age of our school buildings is 70 years old, with 16 buildings over 100 years old.





The cost to install and make all our schools fully air conditioned is approximately

Keeping students and staff cool

WSD implements the following techniques:

- Running ventilation systems early in the morning to cool schools before arrival
- Controlling outside air intake during the school day
- Using oscillating fans to create air movement
- Minimizing using overhead lights
- Switching off unused classroom electronics

- Closing shades to block direct sunlight
- Taking cool-down breaks between lessons
- Avoiding excess movement during midday heat
- Encouraging students and staff to stay hydrated
- Checking students and staff for heat-related health symptoms



Air Quality and You

Poor air quality, caused by pollution or wildfire smoke, can significantly affect your health.

The Government of Canada monitors the impact of air quality on people's health using an Air Quality Health Index (AQHI). When the index is high or very high, an air quality statement or advisory will be issued.

This includes health messaging for general and at-risk populations.

No need to modify your usual outdoor activities unless you experience symptoms such as coughing and throat irritation. Consider reducing or rescheduling strenuous activities outdoors if you experience symptoms such as coughing and throat irritation.



During the wildfire season, you can reduce the impacts of poor air quality by doing the following:



Drinking plenty of water to remain well hydrated.



Setting air conditioning units to recirculate to avoid drawing smoke indoors, including in cars.



Turning on room air cleaners with HEPA filters, if available.



Staying indoors with windows and doors closed. using fans to circulate the air and keep the room cool.



Keeping indoor air cleaner by avoiding smoking or burning other materials.




LIBRARY REVITALIZATION UPDATE
