
#### Room 105 - Mrs. Galbraith

Lastly, we used Cuisenaire Rods to make Tens and Ones and to add numbers. We also practiced making numbers using an empty number line in the air.

#### Room 209 - Ms. Dorman

#### Math

In math, we continued to learn about Time, calculating time duration using addition and subtraction, connecting time to fractions, reading a calendar and writing dates in a variety of ways (DD/MM/YY as 26/02/2025). In math groups, we are practicing operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division), We continued to practice subtraction on a number line,





understanding its whole-part relationship and multiplication using the area model by decomposing the numbers.

#### **Science**

In science, we are learning about the properties of light - light travels in a straight line, reflection of light through videos and experiments led by each co-pilot group.









#### **Health**

We are learning about navigating situations to identify the size of the problem, in order to identify how our reaction should match the size of that problem. We are discussing together with Ms. Parker, Ms. Dorman and Ms. Gill.



#### Literacy

The class continues to write and illustrate a class book for a missing classmate. As well, we are working on sharing our opinions in writing using proper paragraph structure: lead sentence – at least 3 strong reasons / examples – and a wrap up or concluding sentence.

#### **Social Studies**

Ancient Egypt! We have already covered clothing (making paper doll examples), farming, climate, diet (with a food tasting event) and the Nile River. SO much more fun to come!


#### Room 207 - Mme Arnold



#### Room 301 - M Maciejewski

April has been a busy month for room301. In math, students have been working on rounding of decimals numbers, mental math strategies, and collaborative open-ended problem solving. In English, students have continued our novel study and work on figurative language, and continued to make progress on a collaborative project with their reading buddies. In French, students have been working on adjectives, reading, and paragraph dictations. Science class has included further experimentation around states of matter. As we enter into spring, we look forward to seizing the opportunity to learn outdoors and bridge the gap between learning and joy.

#### Room 304 - M Asselin

Our room has been working on a variety of items this month. We have started with statistics, learning various ways to represent data and the calculations that go with them. In French and ELA, the children poetic sides have been tugged all month. They have demonstrated a "love" for poetry through acrostics, book spine poems, colour poems and limericks. Also in French, our music videos have begun. The students had to choose a French song and figure out how to remake the video, in their own way. We have also started our unit on Space by learning about astronauts and the conditions of living in space. It's a busy time and will continue to be that way through the following month.

Students learned about levels of government, rights and responsibilities, electoral districts, the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, and what it means to vote and participate in democracy. Student Vote is a fantastic resource that we used over the course of learning for the month, and we even tried the Youth Vote Compass to see how student beliefs lined up with what the federal parties were pitching.

May will be busy as well with students learning about family life topics, and I'm hoping to have the outline letter to you shortly if I haven't already. As a class we are still working hard to learn about personal responsibility and cooperative learning, as there are times when individual behaviours tend to complicate and challenge our learning activities. I am hopeful that in these final two months of






the year we will have figured out these issues and are enjoying more outdoor learning time as well.

#### Room 311 - Mme Danis

April was such a busy month, and I imagine May won't be any different. Students in 311 were privileged to receive an afternoon visit from the Humane Society where we learned about their mission, services, and met Tooty the rabbit, one of their ambassadors. We also got to participate in Sky Teachings, a one-of-a-kind travelling planetarium to learn about constellations from an indigenous perspective. This month we are working on completing our unit on measurement as well as our individual projects on a country of our choice and focusing on multiplication and division for mathematics.

#### **Indigenous Sky Dome Teaching Experience**

The Indigenous Sky Dome Teaching Experience was a unique and enriching learning opportunity for our students. This interactive program allowed students to explore Indigenous knowledge of the stars and constellations. Through storytelling, cultural teachings, and the use of a planetarium-style dome, students gained a deeper understanding of the connection between Indigenous peoples and the night sky. It was an engaging way to learn about the rich traditions of Indigenous cultures and how they have used the stars for guidance, timekeeping, and storytelling for centuries.





#### **MUSIC**

This month in music we have begun work on the much anticipated annual song tournament. This year the children will be studying 10 music styles. In April we have worked on the first 5:

#### Rhythm & Blues

Students learn about the genre, the historical context, as well as learning about the artist. Children discuss the things they love about the song and performance. They learn to use standard music terminology and how to distinguish and categorize the instruments into family groups. They think about how the music makes them feel and rate the selection up to 5 stars. Each child votes for their favourite song of the two and their vote is tallied together with all the student votes from grades 1-6. A song is selected to move on to round two which will take place in June. It is always exciting to hear the insightful comments from the students and hear about the connections they make between the songs and their own lives.

After spring break we did a throwing and catching review which the kids did very well at. To align with the Jets playoffs we bought brand new hockey nets and started our floor hockey unit. We have been practicing our stick handling, passing and shooting skills! Let's hope we can make it to round two this week! We are welcoming the Assassins rugby club back for some more outdoor workshops in May and Tennis Manitoba is also going to come and do some workshops with the kids which we are thrilled about exposing kids to sports they may not otherwise have the chance to try!


# LIBRARY REVITALIZATION UPDATE
